Important to Publishers.—First Assistant Postmaster-General Hutton has decided that the publishers of matter admitted to the mails as second class may print upon that side of a postal card which is intended for communication bills, receipts and orders for subscription to their publication or publications, as provided in Section 238 of the postal laws and regulations, and may also print the address of the card and enclose the same in their second class matter. GENERAL JOHN BRATTON.

What is said by some of the papers on the 10th of November in connection with the Governorship.

General John Bratton. Several papers in this State have nominated full State tickets for next year's campaign, and combinations are already at work to forestall public sentiment in their favor. It is entirely too early to contemplate the struggle so far ahead, but it is nevertheless interesting to see how the political aspirants of the State thus early have their eyes skinned for the main chance. Some of them, however, are over ambitious and are being led into the "ways that are dark and tricky that are vain" that are peculiar to politicians. Witness whereof the report in circulation that Gen. John Bratton, of Fairfield, has resigned his claims for the Governorship in favor of General Kennedy. General Bratton has never held claim for any "chances" to the Governorship, and if he has resigned any "chances" whatsoever, they belong to the people and not to the General, and he has no right, therefore, to resign what the true people of South Carolina intend to invest him with. His chances are too good to be resigned anyhow—in fact, they are so good that he will be the next Governor of South Carolina, whether he wants to be or not. We think we give the correct sounding of this county when we say Chester is solid for him.

From the Chester Reporter. Extracts from some of our State exchanges show that some of the political carpenters have set themselves together to "fix up things" for the campaign next year. This is a plain case of trying to get a good start. But no matter how "previous" these managers may be, there is one thing they can't manage very easily; and that is the determination of the people of this section to declare a preference for General John Bratton for Governor of South Carolina in 1882. When the proper time comes, a genuine Bratton boom will go up from Fairfield, Chester, York and the entire upper belt of counties, and will make itself heard and felt in the non-inhabited convention. It is no movement of "cup country" against low country, but a firm, persistent call for the services, in the gubernatorial chair, of a most worthy citizen—one who served the State with conspicuous gallantry and fidelity in war, and whose modest demeanor, wise counsels and conscientious discharge of duty in peace have won the admiration of all good people.
