surplus can be converted into greenbacks, and the greenbacks withheld from circulation, but if the surplus is used to purchase and retire Government bonds, the greenbacks will go into circulation again. In other words, the greenbacks can only be kept in the Treasury by a contraction of the currency, unless bank notes increased as rapidly as the greenbacks drawn in.

Can Lock up all the Paper.

It is true that when gold is exchanged for greenbacks the gold so paid out replaces the greenbacks in the circulation, but if bonds are issued for the purchase of gold the proceeds must lie idle in the Treasury if the revenues exceed the expenditures. If the Secretary of the Treasury continues to pay gold on demand and stands ready to replenish the gold reserve by bond issues, it will be possible for the national banks to lock up all the Government paper in the Treasury vaults, making, if they so desire, a corresponding increase in the volume of national bank notes.

The national banks want to retire the greenbacks. The question is: Will they demand the passage of a law providing for the greenbacks, or will they use the power which they now have to lock the greenbacks up in the Treasury and burn them afterwards?

Republican Policy in Doubt.

It is to be regretted that the Republicans do not announce their policy upon the currency question. There is no doubt that many of the leading Republicans favor a retirement of the green-

backs, and the President's inaugural address hinted at that policy, but there has been no formal announcement of it. It would be better if the people were advised in advance of the policy to be pursued, so that they could be considering it; but it has been the almost universal custom to rush through, with limited debate and with as little public discussion as possible, the measures which are a part of the gold standard policy.

Mr. Cleveland urged through Congress the unconditional repeal of the Sherman law, although no party had advocated that measure before the people. After the unconditional repeal had been secured he recommended the retirement of greenbacks by an issue of gold bonds. That, too, was a measure which was never discussed by the public.

From present indications the Republicans intended to appoint a commission to consider the currency question and then push through if possible, a bill providing for the retirement of the greenbacks after a commission of "eminent financiers," selected for the purpose, has reported in favor of such a plan.

Atchison, Kan., May 10.—It is obvious that if the greenback Treasury notes, silver certificates and other paper obligations of the Government are to be presented for redemption in gold, redeemed in gold, reissued and presented again for redemption in gold indefinitely, it will be necessary to have surplus revenues in gold or sell more bonds for gold.

"There needs no ghost, my lord, come from the grave, to tell us this."

As an economic proposition it does not make much difference whether the people are taxed to obtain the surplus revenue or taxed to pay the bonds issued, to enable gamblers and brigands to plunder the nation by methods that make Monte Carlo respectable.

A Fatal Infirmity.

It seems incredible that the ink is yet upon a contract by which President Cleveland transferred the protection of the Treasury and the defence of the public credit to a foreign syndicate which agreed, for a profit of \$8,000,000, to restrain their own deprivations upon the gold reserve till the following October. Any private business conducted on such a scheme would consign its proprietor to the bankruptcy court, the almshouse or the penitentiary, according to the calibre of his lawyer or the disposition of the jury.

The fatal infirmity of Mr. Dingley's theory is his assumption that the Executive has the right to hold the Greenbacks in the Treasury, either to exchange for gold or for the purchase of bonds. The greenbacks, limited to \$346,618,016, were intended as permanent and constant addition to the legal tender currency of the country, and any policy which has for its object their temporary or final withdrawal is without warrant in law.

Another defect in the hypothesis of Mr. Dingley is his assertion that the retention of the greenbacks in the Treasury would not contract the currency because the gold for which they were exchanged would enter into and become a part of the circulating medium of the country. Everybody knows to the contrary.

Gold Not in Circulation.

Practically gold is never in cir-

ulation. It is not available in the daily transactions of wage earners because it is not susceptible of subdividing into coinage of small denominations. In placid times of tranquil and contented prosperity the people prefer paper and gold remains in unsought seclusion. When distrust and apprehension prevails, when credit is impaired and confidence shaken, then gold is hoarded, or transferred in bulk from kingdom to kingdom to be buried in the vaults of the Jews or to replenish the treasuries of monarchs.

The statement of Mr. Dingley emphasizes the declarations of those who framed the financial plank in the St. Louis platform and of their Democratic allies that "sound money" means ultimately the detriment of the greenbacks, the degradation of standard silver money and the transfer of the legal tender function to gold coin alone. The volume of the currency should have no more to say about the number of dollars to be issued than about the number of hats to be made or the number of bushels of wheat to be ground or the number of cattle and hogs to be raised.

Money Depends on Business.

It should retain and assert such power as would punish counterfeits and insure security, but the amount of money should depend on the requirements of business and not on the caprice of Congress, the edicts of rapacious syndicates or the complaint vagaries of a renegade Secretary of the Treasury.

All the people of the United States are resolutely in favor of honest money and the maintenance of public faith, credit and honor. Many of them believe in the principles of a tariff for revenue and for protection. But any measure whose justification is the contraction of the currency, or which will reduce the price of wool, hides and other raw material by unrestrained competition and increase the cost of coats and shoes by heavy duties on the manufactured product, will not be received with unmeasured enthusiasm by the Republican farmers of the Mississippi Valley.
