**YOUTH PAROLED!  
AGAIN IN TOILS**

Walter Hayes Arrested by Sheriff on Charge of Highway Robbery. Mother Died Few Days After his Return to Her.

Greenville, July 27.—Paroled on May 20th of this year in order that he might return to the bedside of his dying mother at the Carolina mill, Walter Hayes, a white boy of 20 years, is once more in the toils of the law. He was arrested Sunday morning together with Russell Bellue, charged with highway robbery. The charge was brought by Will Graham, a young white man of Gastonia, N. C., who states that he was held up and robbed in the vicinity of Cripple Creek Saturday night by Bellue and Hayes.

Graham said at the county jail yesterday that he had been out in Cripple Creek Saturday night and was in the company of these two boys. He said they left Cripple Creek and started toward the Interurban track, and after they had proceeded a short distance Hayes struck him over the head with a bottle. He said Bellue held a pistol upon him while Hayes relieved him of his watch, chain and \$8 in money. Graham identified Bellue and Hayes as the men who robbed him. He pointed out his assailants in a crowd of 12 or more people at the county jail.

Walter Hayes' parole was secured through the efforts of H. P. Burbage, local attorney, and Dr. W. H. Delk, of Mills mill. A petition signed by a number of Greenville citizens was presented to Gov. Blease while he was attending a convention at Anderson, and a few days later a parole was forwarded to Mr. Burbage. Hayes was sent up from Greenville county in January, 1912, being convicted of stealing a horse and buggy. Mr. Burbage stated to a reporter that the parole was secured in order to gratify the request of the aged mother, who was at that time slowly dying of a mental agony.



**NOTICE OF ELECTION.**

State of South Carolina,  
County of Laurens.

Whereas, petitions signed by a legal number of the qualified electors and free-holders residing in Waterloo school district No. 6, Laurens county, South Carolina, asking for an election upon the question of voting an additional 2 mill tax upon the property in said school district to be used for school purposes, have been filed with the county board of education, an election is hereby ordered upon said question, said election to be held on the 11 day of August, 1914, at Mt. Pleasant school house in said district, under the management of the trustees of said district.

Only such electors as return real and personal property for taxation and who exhibit their tax receipts and registration certificates as required in the general election shall be allowed to vote.

Those favoring the 2 mill additional tax shall vote a ballot containing the word "YES" written or printed thereon. Those against the 2 mill additional tax shall vote a ballot containing the word "NO" written or printed thereon. Polls shall open at the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and shall remain open until the hour of 4 o'clock in the afternoon when they shall be closed, and the ballots counted.

The trustees shall report the result of the election to the county auditor and county superintendent of education within ten days thereafter.
