Congressman Scarborough Thinks it Should Supplant the Dispensary.

A Washington correspondent says: The South Carolina representatives at the capital are greatly interested in the discussions that are proceeding in the State over the dispensary law...

"From a financial standpoint the dispensary system has been a success. In some sections drunkenness has been decreased. Instead of using the dispensary law to minimize the consumption of liquor, the State board of control, from the enactment of this law to date, has been too ready to open dispensaries...

"I believe that some features of the dispensary law are admirable. Personally, I would prefer prohibition, but no summary legislation can be enforced unless it is backed by the moral sentiment of the people. Unfortunately for us, I fear, we have not reached the place where the moral sentiment upon this question is sufficiently acute to secure an honest enforcement of prohibition laws...

LESS FERTILIZER IN GEORGIA.

Assistant Commissioner of Agriculture Figures That Farmers Have Bought Less Than Half as Much Fertilizer This Year As Last.

Atlanta, Ga., Feb. 2.—Assistant Commissioner of Agriculture R. F. Wright gave out figures Wednesday, showing that during the month of January, 1905, the farmers have bought only about 48 per cent. as much fertilizer as they did in January, 1904...

In January, 1904, the department of agriculture of the state sold tags for 146,578 tons of fertilizer, while during the month of January just closed, it only sold tags for 72,582 tons.

This is regarded as a significant fact in view of the agitation in favor of a reduction of cotton acreage and of the use of fertilizers, though Assistant Commissioner Wright says the reduction may not continue and following months may overcome the big falling off in January.

DARLINGTON MURDERESS.

Supreme Court Refuses to Sustain Appeal for Suspension of Sentence.

Columbia, Feb. 4.—In an opinion handed down today the supreme court, Judge Gary dissenting, refuses to sustain the appeal in the case of Moses Ham and Sam Marks, the former given a life sentence and the latter a death sentence for the murder of a white man in Darlington. The motion for suspension of sentence was based on alleged discovered evidence, based on a statement alleged to have been made by W. D. Blackman, who refused to make an affidavit, that the murdered man had an open knife in his hand when the difficulty occurred.

KILLED BY CRAZY WIFE.

Boston, Mass., Feb. 4.—George H. Sargent, a janitor, was shot and killed last night by his wife in their home here. The woman is believed to be insane as no reason for the tragedy is known.

COLLEGE BURNED.

Water Pipes Frozen and Fire Department Could Render no Assistance. Buchanan, W. Va., Feb. 4.—An explosion of gas in the basement of the main building of the Wesleyan University of West Virginia started a fire that totally destroyed the building and contents this morning. Owing to the severe cold weather the pipes and water supply of the city were completely tied up and no assistance to the college fire department could be given.

A MURDERER ARRESTED.

George H. Wood Remanded to the Tombs After an Examination Before Magistrate Pool.

New York, Feb. 4.—George H. Wood, who was arrested in connection with the murder of George Williams near Plainfield, N. J., was arraigned before Magistrate Pool of the police court this morning. He was remanded back to the tombs and on Monday he will be taken to Plainfield. He repeated in detail, the story told to the police last night, and, when asked a question which directly connects him with the murder, he said: "I don't remember."


