DILLON AUDITOR PUT UNDER BOND

Experts Are at Work—Accountants Going Over Books of Officers. Grand Jury Prosecuting Investigation.

Dillon, May 22.—With C. G. Bruce, auditor of Dillon county, under bond on a warrant charging misappropriation of the county's funds, and with the grand jury continuing an investigation through a firm of expert accountants, Dillon court house circles, and indeed a considerable portion of the people of the community, are stirred to the centre. Pending the completion of the audit, the grand jury refuses to give out anything. Bruce has sent his resignation as auditor to the governor.

On Wednesday the grand jury of Dillon county met for the purpose of considering a preliminary report of Malcolm & Braddy, expert accountants and auditors, who have for some time been auditing the books of all the county officials. As a result of the partial report and other evidence obtained by the grand jury a warrant was sworn out and issued for C. G. Bruce, county auditor, charging him with unlawfully, wilfully and feloniously taking and stealing and appropriating to his own use on June 6, 1913, a sum approximating \$125 and on other days before and since the sum of \$1,600.

The warrant was issued early in the afternoon and was given to the sheriff to serve. For some time Bruce could not be located. Late in the evening he appeared and gave himself up to the sheriff, in whose custody he remained until the following day, when he was taken by the sheriff to friends and relatives in the upper end of the county, and gave bond in the sum of \$5,000 for appearance at the September term of court.

Bruce sent his resignation to the governor on Thursday morning.

The grand jury will not give out anything until it has gone further into matters and has given the accountants time to finish their work, which is only about half completed. A detailed audit is being made and totals are not taken as has been done by some auditors heretofore.

This has created quite a sensation throughout the county and as the investigation goes on the public eagerly awaits a report from the grand jury.
