MAY BE WOOD—BRIDGE. Cost of Steel Structure seems Too Great.

The county commissioners yesterday afternoon received bids for the erection of the new bridge over Lawson's Fork, but have not awarded the contract, and the supervisor says that it may be several days before it is awarded.

It is probable that the commissioners will have the stone work done by county labor, and as they have only a certain amount of funds to be used for this bridge it may be that a wooden bridge will be built instead of a steel one as was at first thought.

The cost of a steel bridge will be more than the commissioners thought, as has been shown by the bids received yesterday and the original plan may be abandoned and a cheaper bridge built.
