**Destructive Red Spider Is at Work**

**Demonstration Agent Tiller Issues Warning and Tells How to Destroy the Pest.**

Mr. Tiller, the local demonstration agent for Clemson Agriculture College, declares that the Red Spider is working havoc on several farms in the county, in one instance threatening destruction to the entire crop. He issues the following instructions for protection:

It is very important that you look over your farm and destroy all weeds such as violet beds, polk weeds, blackberry, gimpsom weed and other such weeds as grow on old hedge rows. As to the treatment, pull and burn all infected plants and spray all plants that are adjoining those infected; where the insects have just started it is best to pull up and burn but where it has gained headway it is best to spray after burning all infected plants. The spray to use should be potassium sulphide 3 pounds to 100 gallons of water; also, lime sulphur one gallon to 30 gallons of water.

He will assist you as far as possible in the fight on this or any other insect if you will call on him.

Though badly bruised, he was thought to have a good chance to recover, when tetanus developed.

**Notice of Election.**

State of South Carolina, County of Chesterfield.

A petition of a majority of the Resident Free-Holders and Qualified Electors, of the age of twenty-one years, residing in Shiloh School District No. 11, having called for an election to be ordered by the the Trustees of the said district, on the Question of changing the method of erection of a school house from bonds to tax; It is Hereby ordered that an election be held at the School House in the said district on the 10th Day of August 1915 for the purpose of deciding the following question, Whether it is expedient? to change the levy on the district at present to pay interest and sinking fund on the bond levy of 1914 into a special tax amounting to 10 mills for a period not exceeding two years, upon the condition that a loan of \$1,000 be secured at 5 per cent interest, which shall be supplemented by \$300 by the County and \$200 by the state, making \$1,500 to be used for building purposes. And it is further conditioned that if the vote be in favor of the proposed change to a tax of 10 mills that the County Senator and Representatives shall be authorized to make such levy, and the Trustees be notified to draw on the county treasurer for the Accumulated Interests and Sinking Fund of the Bond Issue of 1914 as though it were special tax for building purposes, and also to declare the bond issue of 1914 null and void by a special act of the legislature of 1915.
