The fourteenth anniversary of the Home was celebrated on the 10th of January, 1869, Gabriel Schwartz, Esq., being the orator on that occasion. Owing to the distressed condition of business, the contributions did not exceed \$3,000.

At the annual meeting of the Association, held April 4th, President George Jonas reported that no steps had been taken towards the building of a new Home, owing to lack of means, and great increase in current expenses.

It was contemplated to repair the present building, and add an annex. Even this could not be effected without calling for further aid. It was proposed to issue bonds of the Association for \$500 and \$100 each, payable in three years, with 8 per cent. interest coupons, payable semi-annually.

Inmates in the Home, 96; membership, 366.

The fifteenth anniversary of the Home was celebrated on the 10th of January, 1870, Rev. I. L. Leucht delivering the prayer on the occasion, and Mr. Max Dinkelspiel the oration.

At the annual meeting of the Association, held March 20th, the president Isaac Scherck, Esq., reported that the buildings and improvements to the Home had been completed at an outlay of \$39,945.91. The membership was 405. Number of inmates, 88, of whom two are widows.

The president alluded to the fact that during the past year there had been collected nearly \$19,000 from voluntary offerings of less than 300 persons, and of these, fully 250 residents of this city.

The sixteenth anniversary of the Home was celebrated on the 8th day of January, 1871, Mr. Joseph Hirsch, of Vicksburg, Miss., delivering the oration.

The sixteenth annual meeting was held March 26th, 1871. After congratulating the Association on the completion of the new Home, the president states, with much gratification, that the debt resting upon it had been decreased by about \$2,500, and

the financial condition much improved. The receipts proper were 19,414.12, and the expenses \$14,147.50. Number of inmates, 86; roll of membership, 411.

The seventeenth anniversary of the Home was celebrated on January 7th, 1872, and Mr. S. M. Levin delivered the anniversary address.

The annual meeting was held March 31st, 1872.

The president, in his report, alluded to the fact that the debt of the institution had been reduced to twelve thousand dollars.

Number of inmates, 77; membership, 431. Receipts, \$14,789.28, and expenditures, 11,961.11.

The eighteenth anniversary of the Home was celebrated on January 19th, 1873, and Mr. Isaiah D. Moore delivered the anniversary oration.

At the eighteenth annual meeting of the Association, President Isaac Scherck, in his report, stated that the indebtedness of the Association had been reduced to six thousand dollars, and that the institution continued in a good and prosperous condition. Receipts, \$15,634.12; expenditures, \$11,773.84. Number of inmates 80, and roll of membership, 383.

The board, at its meeting of 7th of December, decided upon the 11th day of January, 1874, for the celebration of the 19th anniversary of the Home, and that the usual oration be dispensed with, the celebration to be opened and closed with prayer.

The nineteenth annual meeting was held March 29th. The president, Mr. Isaac Scherck, begins his report as follows:

"The year just closed, visited by so many commercial and financial disasters, finds the Home still in a flourishing condition, and, in spite of the great depression and gloom, the general stagnancy of business, those dependent on your bounty have never felt any want."

Inmates remaining in the Home, 91; membership, 375. Receipts, \$12,761.69; disbursements, \$12,519.65.


