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Fatal Accident

PROMINENT YOUNG MAN KILLED
NEAR KNOWLES, N. M.

A horrible accident occurred yesterday morning of this week when John Raymond Shipp, son of Mr. Tom Shipp living near Knowles was killed, and buried Lovington Wednesday. It seemed that they were driving a round-up of cattle at their place known as the "West camp" southwest of Knowles when one of the cows broke from the herd and ran off, young Shipp taking in after it. His horse became truly and ran past the cow after she had turned. So in trying to turn his horse quickly it missed its footing and fell. Mr. Shipp quit the horse just as he struck the ground and tried to make his escape, but in another moment the horse had lunged over and fallen across the body of the young man crushing out his last hope of escape and with it his life, before any powerless witnesses, most of whom were his relatives, it being only a short distance from the scene. A physician was called immediately, but he only lived about seven minutes after the accident before even speaking a word. Mere words cannot express the told sorrow of the parents, sisters, and brothers who are left to mourn his absence from their home, nor his friends from the sudden snatching of his buoyant spirit from their midst.

He was well known his father being two places one just across the Texas line and the one mentioned above. He spent last term school at the New Mexico Military Institute at Roswell, and was considered to have been one of the brightest and most handsome young men in the college. Nearing his 21st birthday, it is no wonder that the entire community both there and Lovington were shocked by the news that so bright a life would be so suddenly snatched in its prospects. The burial took place at the Lovington cemetery conducted by the Odd Fellows Rev. J. H. Clouse conducting the funeral service. Many automobiles came in the procession from the Shipp home and many more were lined up here awaiting their arrival which was at 12 o'clock. The Odd Fellows marched through the streets preceding the procession, then took place at the cemetery where they proceeded with the burial services. Several songs were sung accompanied by Mr. Tandy with his violin, among which was a special solo song by Miss Newma Shepard. The grave was neatly lined with white and bordered with evergreens, and when finished was covered with evergreens and flowers, but 500 people witnessed the scene, showing by their words and actions their deep sympathy.
