Non-irrigated Truck To Show at Fair

Mr. J. R. Baker of Midway was down Monday of this week and in conversation stated that although it had been very dry, he had succeeded in raising enough field corn for roasting ears and enough to fatten five hogs. Of course it is nothing to compare with the corn raised last year, but does well to be anything at all. Also has several acres of cotton off of which he thinks he will pick two bales, and he regrets now, not having planted the most of it deep enough as the nicest that he has was planted the deepest at first. He also intends showing a sample of his apple crop which was non-irrigated this year.

We are glad to note that Mr. Baker intends bringing samples of his "dry" land farming to be exhibited and hope that his neighbors will do likewise, as well as bringing in irrigated products.

First Building West of Bank
All wanting space for individual or community exhibit will please notify Mrs. E. D. Oliver by phone or leave word at the Leader not later than Monday morning Aug. 20, as the hall is to be divided into spaces at that time.

Everything being exhibited for prizes, must be in place by Wednesday evening Aug. 22, as the judges will pass judgement and award prizes on same at 8 o'clock Thursday morning before the rush of the night seers, after which the doors will be thrown open to the general public as a free exhibit to all. Anything brought in later will be gladly received, but cannot be passed on for prizes.

Everyone is wanted to bring anything from vegetable, and needle work to poultry, but as the space is limited a small quantity of each variety is requested. No entrance fee will be charged on products brought in and admission is free to all who would like to inspect them. Exhibitors may be on hand if they choose when judgement is passed.

Mr. Knorr County Agricultural Club organizer of Carlsbad stated to the president of the agricultural club of this place, Mrs. E. D. Oliver that he would act as one of judges and would insure two more non-interested and competent judges in which Mr. A. D. Crile, manager of the Roswell State Fair was suggested, and which, with any other whom he may choose has met with the unanimous approval of the club here, and we only hope that Mr. Crile with one other gentleman will accept.
