Passengers who came from the east on the train which reached Ash Fork on Saturday, February 11, tell of an awful experience with the storm and cold wave coming across Kansas and eastern Colorado. The cold wave struck them on the Kansas plains Thursday and the water pipes and steam heating pipes of the cars froze up. It was simply impossible to force the steam through the pipes hot enough to keep it from condensing and freezing. The result was the pipes froze and burst, and in trying to thaw them out the cars were flooded; ice formed on the floors of the cars, making them colder than before. The railroad men did everything they could to make people as comfortable as possible, but in face of the conditions they were practically helpless and the passengers nearly froze to death. It was an awful trip.—Journal-Miner.

Chief Clerk Murphy, of the surveyor general's office received a clipping from an American-Georgia, paper, and an extract is made therefrom: "A quiet marriage at Albany has furnished a tragedy. Fred Caselle, of Arizona, a steward at the brigade hospital, as a result of this marriage, is a prisoner in the Dougherty county jail, charged with bigamy. Miss Clara L. Sparks, nurse in the hospital, is the unfortunate second wife of Caselle, and has left for her home in New York. The case has created something of a sensation in Albany and especially among the soldiers of Camp Churchman. The pair were married January 23, but it was kept secret until yesterday, when it leaked out. As soon as the officers in charge were apprised of the fact they had Caselle placed under arrest and preferred a charge of bigamy against him. He is confined in the county jail, and will be given a military trial.

A Rich Strike.

Some time since Frank Johnston and Fred Coleman, both well known in this city, were prospecting in Cave Creek in the Huachuca mountains, and accidentally found an old dump and tunnel which showed evidences of not having been worked for many years. The tunnel ran in about forty feet, when it turned to the left about twenty feet when it opened into a large cave. The boys built two ladders and succeeded in going down to a small projection, from which place they discovered the bottom of the cave to be filled with water. Being of somewhat venturesome minds, they built a raft large enough to carry them and began an exploration of the underground lake. On one side they found a few copper stains, they worked here a few days but could find nothing to justify further work so they went on the east of the cave and found another copper streak; this they followed through about five feet of lime when they opened up a large body of rich copper ore, the whole face of the drift being in good ore. The boys have for the present stopped work, and are now figuring on running a tunnel from below to tap the lake so as to draw the water off that they may prosecute work on their claim. Development of this property will be watched with interest.

AN OBSERVER.
