A Huachuca Deal.

From a gentleman, who recently returned from the Huachuca, the ORB learns that on Monday the final papers were fixed and signed which bonds the Pete Connors gold property in Carr canyon to Chicago capitalists, represented by O. B. Hardy. A bond is taken on the property for six months at a price of \$10,000, \$2,000 being paid down. The property is situated on the south side of Carr canyon, on the divide, between that and Millers. A number of shafts have been put down on the ledge, one to a depth of 46 feet which is all in good ledge matter carrying free gold. The ledge in some places on the surface is over twenty feet wide and rock broken from any portion of it shows free gold to a more or less extent. A small sized gold nugget, about as large as a pencil tip was taken out of the shaft, which Mr. Hardy now has as a pocket piece.
The claim was the property of Pete Connors and Capt. Leavelle, formerly stationed at Fort Huachuca, but at present in Utah. Messrs. Chatham & Woods, of Chicago, were out and inspected the property the fore part of this week and are exceedingly pleased with the outlook for the mine.
It is their intention to go to work at once on the property and Mr. Hardy has gone east to purchase a sixty stamp mill to place on the property. A mining man of experience states that "there is ore enough in sight to run a mill of that capacity for at least ten years." A force of eight men is now employed taking out ore which will be stored to await the arrival of the mill. There is an abundance of water and fuel in the vicinity of where the mill is to be erected, and when once started there seems to be no reason why its stamps should not drop incessantly.
