WOVED TO DISMISS.

The following which is taken from the Range News of October 4, regarding Mr. Land's action in the Morgan-Mitchell case, speaks for itself, and the Ouz's article some few weeks since is confirmed:

Morgan and Mitchell were arrested charged with being implicated in the Duncan killing. They were taken before Judge Nichols of Wilcox, and the examination started when District Attorney Land moved to have the charge dismissed, which the judge did, whereupon the accused were rearrested and taken to Tombstone.

Any attempt to depict the indignation of the people in Wilcox and vicinity would be futile. The most remarkable circumstance connected with the whole affair was that the persons interested in the prosecution were quite as indignant as the other side. Some of District Attorney Land's most staunch supporters in the past were loudest in their denunciation of his action.

Mr. Land claims to have for his course good reasons which he can not at present divulge. Events will doubtless show whether this claim is true, but for the present it would be impossible to make the people of this section believe otherwise than that Judge Wright's charge of trickery was a just one, and that the accused and their attorneys and all the witnesses were to be dragged over to the county seat to put a little money in circulation there.

Men of a judicial mind do not fail to recognize the fact that the action of the District Attorney was practically a confession that there was no case against the accused. Had there been sufficient proof and the examination been allowed to proceed, the defendants would unquestionably have been held to the grand jury under heavy bonds, which would have kept them away from the scene of the crime.

By authoritative advice from Tucson we learn that the date for holding the next session of the District court of Cochise county, is set at the first Monday in December.

The breach between Gov. Lowndes, Republican candidate for re-election in Maryland, and Senator Wellington, will probably insure the return of that state this fall to the Democratic column. Wellington is a bitter man and his withdrawal as chairman of the Republican State committee, was accompanied by remarks distinctly injurious to the ticket.

Tax President and the Secretary of War have it advertised in substance that they have nothing to do with the letting down of the Chinese exclusion bars, because it was done by a clerk in the State department to whom they had delegated their powers. How can they be held responsible, when they left the decision of the whole question to Assistant Secretary Hill?

War in South Africa is expected to begin in October, if at all. In the north temperate zone, where most of the world's fighting has been done, people are accustomed to think of war beginning in the spring. Flowers bloom in the spring, and so do wars—in the north temperate zone. It must be remembered, however, that South Africa is in the south temperate zone, and that when it is autumn here it is spring down there. That explains the fact of a war beginning in October. The grass will grow up on the veldt in October in the Boer country, just as it does here in April. When the grass has come the Boers can campaign without carrying rags for their horses.

Articles of Incorporation of the Pittsburgh-Arizona Gold and Copper Company.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, Frank Hare, John M. Montgomery, Homer T. Fisher, Benjamin Bartlett and Stephen A. D. Upton, have this day associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation, under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, under the following conditions, to-wit:

I. The name of the corporation shall be PITTSBURGH-ARIZONA GOLD AND COPPER COMPANY, and the principal place for the transaction of the business of said corporation, shall be at Charleston, Cochise County Arizona Territory.

II. The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation, shall be to buy, sell, lease, or operate, mines of gold, silver, copper, lead or other valuable minerals, mills or smelters for the reduction of the same to bullion or concentrates, to buy and sell goods, wares and merchandise; also, to acquire real estate, such as town or city lots, ranches and irrigating ditches and flumes and to use and operate the same for the benefit of the corporation.
