SHORT NEWS ITEMS

Brief Mention of Facts and Doings of the Universe.

Washington, April 9.—Afternoon further discussion today the senate, rejected the sectarian school amendment to the Indian appropriation bill offered by Mr. Jones, (dem) by a vote of 33 to 16.

Washington, April 10.—Adjutant General Corbin said yesterday regarding the dispatch from Manila which stated that reinforcements had been requested by General Young and Bell of General Otis:

"No official notice has been given me regarding this matter but I can state that the forces under Young and Bell are inadequate."

"The adjutant general said that with such reinforcements as desired Generals Young and Bell would actively engage the insurgents and attempt, if possible, to restore peace in the provinces of Luzon."

The French cabinet has officially decided to inaugurate the Paris exposition April 14.

Chicago's registration for the April election is 347,782. The vote of New York in the last election for mayor was 526,556.

Within three years William Jennings Bryan has traveled nearly 100,000 miles for the purpose of speech making.

Travel from the United States to the Paris exposition has begun, and all berths on steamers to sail from New York for the next three months are engaged.

Forty-eight young women have been graduated from the woman's law class of the University of New York. Miss Catherine Reed, daughter of ex-Speaker Thomas B. Reed, was one of the number.

The Loud bill, relating to second class mail matter, was agreed to in amended form by the house committee on post-offices and postroads on March 30. The amended bill eliminates the points of friction, particularly that referring to country newspapers.

The repeal of the Horton law, which takes effect September 1, will probably result in Connecticut becoming the battle ground for fistie contests. The license in New York expire May 1, and the police commissioners are opposed to renewing them for the short period covering the life of the law.

The house committee on public lands has directed a favorable report on the bill for a "buffalo reserve" in New Mexico. The reserve is limited to 12,000 acres in the unoccupied and arid district, and its occupancy will be under a temporary lease. The purpose is to recruit the fast disappearing American bison.

Secretary Root has made public a telegram from General Davis, military governor of Porto Rico, in regard to the present labor troubles near San Juan, but beyond indicating his own private opinion there is no likelihood of a recurrence of the riots, the secretary declined to discuss the matter for publication.

A. R. Peacock's special over the San Francisco system covered the distance from Los Angeles to Chicago, 2,365 miles, in 55 hours and 30 minutes. The reason for Mr. Peacock's record breaking trip was his desire to reach at an early time to attend the reorganization meeting of the Carnegie company, in which he is largely interested.

Maud Gonne, the Irish agitator, has been giving a scathing denunciation of McKinley through the Paris newspapers. She has just returned from the United States, and is talking volubly to Paris reporters. She charges McKinley with having outraged the sentiments of the Irish in America by his pro-British policy against the Boers. She tells France that this anti-Boer attitude will prevent his re-election.

When it comes to big budgets France easily takes the lead of the procession. Her annual appropriation bill now amounts to more than \$700,000,000. The contribution of each Frenchman, therefore amounts to about \$20 per annum, and as the debt exceeds \$6,000,000,000, the amount of this debt, which weighs upon each Frenchman from the cradle to the grave, may be estimated.
