Twenty tons of acid per day are required for the leaching works. The company are now opening up sulphide ore on Gold gulch, from which they expect to make their own acid.

The rapid growth of the copper industry in the United States, and the large proportion which this country supplies of the world's copper, is shown by a German publication entitled "A Century of Copper." It shows that the United States has during the years 1894-1900 produced more than one-half of the copper of the world, while in the preceding decade it supplied about one-third of the world's production, and in the decade, 1871-1880, the portion supplied by the United States was only about one-sixth of the total. The growth of the copper production in the century has been very rapid, being in the first decade 91,000 tons, in the fifth decade 291,000 tons, and in the tenth decade, which ends with 1900, 3,643,000 tons, of which 1,963,000 tons is supplied by North America, a large proportion of this being from the United States. The greatly increased demand for this material is illustrated by the fact that, although the production has increased from 505,909 tons in the decade, 1891, 1885 to 1890, to 3,643,000 tons in the decade, 1891 to 1900, the average price has fallen only a more than half, so that, while the production has increased more than six fold, it cost about one-half of what it did.
