THE establishment of a water system for Bisbee, sufficient for the supply of the town, is a matter that must be attended to before another dry season comes round. The source from whence this supply is brought will, of course, be a matter of consideration for those who are interested, or for the company who undertake the task. As a speculation, the ownership of an ample water supply should be a paying proposition. Bisbee is, and will be, a growing town. The mines that are in process of development will be a sure factor in the formation of a large extension of the city limits in the direction of South Bisbee, while already the population stands high in the list of Arizona's cities. It is a serious matter for the householders to be restricted in the quantity of water, and such restriction is necessary under the present conditions, but the shortage of water becomes a positive source of danger when the probability of fire is considered. The crowded state of the town with the buildings, composed of most inflammable material, is appalling to contemplate, and the result of a conflagration would be far reaching. It is impossible to suggest means to rectify this state of things except by the prompt and well directed installation of a thoroughly ample supply of water, and those who are in possession of extensive interests in this community, as well as the financial means to carry out any scheme that they may consider would be successful, may reasonably consider the propriety of taking the steps necessary to secure us from a yearly repetition of this shortage in that great essential to comfort and safety.

Now comes John Burns, the great English Labor leader, and member of parliament for Battersea, and asserts that London is again darkened by a cloud of immorality probably unsurpassed in the history of the great metropolis. Burns asserts that the West End, the fashionable portion of London, reeks with the "bestial form of vice of eastern origin" and offers to take the Home Secretary to haunts where filth and corruption flourish. Burns also asserts that things are tolerated in England that would not be allowed in America. This state of things appears to be largely due to the fact that the police are controlled by the club proprietor and brothel keepers, and bribery is freely used. It will be remembered that Lexow and Mazet committees showed the similar conditions in New York and the finding of these committees led to the partial freeing of New York from the bondage of filth.

HANDWRITING is said by students of that class of science to show accurately the character of the individual. The formation of letters are an index to the possession of certain qualities that may be good or bad according to the way those letters may be written. The O left open at the top, as is often the case, indicates a usually liberal disposition and it is averred that if the writer will take the pains to properly complete the letter he will overcome this fault in his mental makeup. The letter T also

comes under the criticism of the scientist. If a man crosses his small t's only partially, he is often a character easily led. Let him but practice the placing of a strong, well defined bar across that letter and he may gain a spirit of wilfulness that may stand him in good stead. If this theory be actually correct, then those people who know themselves to be the victims of a generosity that dips into and empties their pockets may really find a cure for the failing in the careful practice of a perfect O, while the man who can be persuaded into the commission of acts that put him in a false position can become noted for pursuing his own course in life by the simple plan of learning to strongly cross his t's.

ENGLAND has not for several generations been under such a cloud of danger and adversity as she undoubtedly is at the present time. The Boer war claims the attention of a large army, while India is being denuded of a considerable portion of her troops, maintained there, for service in China. The natives of India are in a state of unrest and there is danger of a rebellion as far reaching and as deadly as the Sepoy mutiny. The intentions of Russia toward the Indian empire are well known, and a conflict between the powers over an attempted division of China is altogether probable, in which England would be involved.
