ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF THE Solomon Springs Consolidated Mining Company.

Know all men by these presents that we, J. G. Pritchard, A. J. McDermott, J. B. Angus, D. O. Williams, Richard Humphrey and Arthur S. Pritchard, of the town of Bisbee, county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona, have this day associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and we do hereby certify and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation: ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be the Solomon Springs Consolidated Mining Company, and its principal place of transacting business shall be at the town of Bisbee, county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona.

ARTICLE II. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted is to purchase, own, sell, lease or develop and obtain titles to mines, mills, smelters and mining property of every description; the purchase of ores, metals and minerals; to acquire, sell and deal in personal property and merchandise, and to do and perform any and all acts necessary or incidental to the aforesaid business.

ARTICLE III. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), divided into 50,000 shares of the par value of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) each, said capital stock to be paid on the issuance and delivery of the certificate of stock to the purchasers thereof, and to be forever non-assessable.

ARTICLE IV. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of these articles of incorporation for record in the office of the County Recorder of the county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter.

ARTICLE V.
