Office of the Board of Supervisors, Clifton, Greenlee County, State of Arizona.

Clifton, Arizona, April 6th, 1921.

The Board of Supervisors met this day in continued session. Present A. C. Stanton, Chairman, F. R. Hightower, Member and A. L. Terry Clerk.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the following resolution is passed:

WHEREAS, during the late war and at the present time, various private and governmental agencies, State and Federal, including our own State Health Department, having been engaged in a special campaign directed towards the developments of a Protective Social Measures Program, calculated to suppress and control Venereal Diseases and their attendant evils, and

WHEREAS, said program required the simultaneous coordination and cooperation of efforts among various law enforcing officials, doctors and health officers, parents and educators, and those responsible for recreational activities, and

WHEREAS, the local and general success of such program is in no small degree, dependent upon the simultaneous joint and several applications thereof in and by the several cities and counties of the State.

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Greenlee County, Arizona.

That we endorse and commend activities attempting to establish the so called Protective Social Measures Program, including therein Educational Law Enforcement, Medical and Recreational Measures, believing, that it will make for improved health and happiness of the People of Arizona.

That we urge the cities and counties of the State to carefully consider this program to the end that at the next general meeting of the various County Supervisors, some appropriate plan of joint or simultaneous action be worked out.

That these resolutions be spread of record; that the press be furnished copies thereof and that the Clerk be instructed to send copies hereof, press copies preferably, to each of the other Boards of County Supervisors.

The Board of Supervisors met this day in continued regular session with all members and the clerk present.

Upon motion made, seconded and by unanimous vote the Board passed the following resolution and a copy of same is ordered sent to the State Engineer at Phoenix, Arizona.

WHEREAS, the State Highway Department is desirous of completing the construction of the Clifton-Springerville Road in Greenlee County, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the State Engineer desires to apply for Federal assistance for the completion of said Road, and

WHEREAS, under the rules of the United States Bureau of Public Roads, it is necessary to show from what sources the funds to match the Federal Aid are derived and it is required that these funds be spent under the direction of the State Highway Department, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has an unexpended sum of \$36,000.00 in the Clifton-Springerville Road Fund and an unexpended balance of \$40,000.00 in the Greenlee County 75% Fund

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Greenlee County, Arizona, that they hereby approve of the requesting of Federal Aid for this proposed road construction and that they hereby appropriate the \$76,000.00 of said Clifton-Springerville Road Fund and the Greenlee County 75% Fund for such work and hereby constitute the State Engineer as their agent and engineer for the expenditure of this amount of money, subject to the inspection and supervision of the United States Bureau of Public Roads.

We hereby certify that the above and foregoing is a true, full and complete copy of the resolution of the Board of Supervisors of Greenlee County, Arizona, relating to the Clifton-Springerville Road, passed and adopted this 11th, day of April, A. D., 1921.

Brooks and Dick Worsham, Deputy Sheriff's are hereby dispensed with effective May 15, 1921 and the appointment of Johnnie Fulcher Ranger Deputy at the rate of \$125.00 per month is changed to Deputy Sheriff at the rate of \$150.00 per month, effective May 15th, 1921. The Board of Supervisors and Sheriff reserve the right to dispense with the services of Mr. Fulcher at any time without cause.

Upon motion by F. R. Hightower, seconded by A. C. Stanton and carried unanimously the following resolution is passed.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board of Supervisors the amount of work to be performed in the office of the County Recorder does not justify the employment of a chief Deputy at the rate of \$150.00 per month, and

WHEREAS, there is need of an assistant in said office at times during the year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, and it is hereby resolved that the salary of the Deputy Recorder be reduced from \$150 per month to \$100.00 per month, effective May 15, 1921.

ONE DEAD, ONE HURT, IN COCHISE ACCIDENT

One man was killed and another badly injured in an accident that occurred at the Central Copper mine near Dos Cabezas in Cochise county, according to a report sent John F. White state mine inspector.

Operations have been suspended at the mine until an investigation can be made.

Only meager reports of the tragedy were reported in a telegram signed by John W. Proutt, Jr., mine manager. The names of the dead and wounded were not included in the message. E. F. Meyers, deputy state mine inspector, has been detailed to make a thorough investigation.

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
