We therefore argue that the best and most sincere efforts of well-disposed people who seek to alleviate the mental darkness of the savage Apaches, are not only useless, but a detriment to their advancement so long as they are permitted to return to their old haunts, old associations and pernicious influences.

These properties are among the productive mines of Pinal county and promise to add largely to its fame as the richest mineral county in the Territory.

Arizona News.

The Tomblons Democrat is reported dead again.

Jack Adams' house at Ash Springs was recently burned by an unknown incendiary.

Hon. Pat Hamilton has accepted the position of secretary of the Phenix Immigration Union.

It is estimated that the timber destroyed by the fire in the Santa Catalinas, set by Indians, was worth over \$2,000,000.

Phenix makes vaccination compulsory, by a recently enacted ordinance, with \$300 or six months imprisonment as a penalty.

A new postoffice has been established at Clearwater's ranch, Chino valley, Yavapai county, with D. W. Clearwater as postmaster.

Charles Hayse, owner of the Fame mine, Globe, died on Saturday, June 11th, of pneumonia. He was 55 years of age and a native of Prussia.

The ranch house of the Inter Ocean Cattle company in the Santa Catalinas was not burned as reported. It escaped by the safe distance of several miles.

Judge A. D. Duff of Phenix, has been appointed register of the Tucson land office. He is said to be a gentleman of ability and integrity.

Judge Barnes has decided that the Camerons were not justified in fencing lands outside of the recognized four square leagues of the San Rafael de la Zanja grant in Pima County.

Thomas Morrell, a lad of 13, had his right hand nearly all shot away by the accidental discharge of a shotgun with which he was hunting. It happened at Prescott on Wednesday, June 15th.

O. H. Christy has been awarded the contract for supplying the Insane Asylum with fresh beef; Goldman & Co furnishes the provisions and sundry supplies, and Pierce Ford, of Tucson, got the contract for repairing the roof.

Deputy Sheriff Thompson was stabbed and seriously wounded by a drunken Mexican whom he was trying to arrest in a row at a wedding in Morenci, Graham county, on Friday night of last week.

Dan McLaughlin, engineer at the Con. Arizona mine, Arivaca, fell from the shaft ladder, a distance of 100 feet and was instantly killed, on the morning of the 17th. He had descended to fix a badly working pump and when coming up again a rung of the ladder broke.
