MINING IN THE WEST.

WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED BY THE MINING INDUSTRY IN THE WEST. SOME OF ITS PHYSICAL FEATURES INTELLIGENTLY SET FORTH.

APACHE COUNTY.

One of the most thirty Counties of Arizona, devoted to Agriculture and Stock Raising.

APACHE COUNTY.

The fourth session of the legislative assembly of Arizona created the county of Apache out of the eastern portion of Yavapai county. At the time of its organization in 1879, its southern boundary extended south to the channel of the Gila river on the west, the new county was bounded by the counties of Gila and Yavapai; on the north by Utah, and on the east by the Territory of New Mexico. Within the limits above described, was a vast extent of country, larger perhaps than the state of New York; but nevertheless, possessing at this time few natural possibilities for the husbandman. It is also true that several thousands of acres of very fair arable lands, principally along the Little Colorado River, the Showlow creek, the Silver creek, and other small tributaries; and, with the aid of dams, reservoirs, ditches, etc., etc., these lands are to-day producing, in some places, crops of grain usually raised in this climate and altitude.

APACHE COUNTY.

Thirty miles south from St. Johns is the beautiful valley in which is situated the town of Springerville. The altitude of this valley is about 6,000 and 7,000 feet, but notwithstanding its great altitude, magnificent crops of barley, wheat, and other small grain are here grown each year; also vegetables and some fruit. Continuing south from Springerville, six or eight miles further, brings us to Radd Creek, where there are a few good farms; four or five miles further south is the Nutriosa creek, upon which are several excellent farms, also here located a few small settlements. Sixteen miles further, still in a southerly direction, we find Bush Valley has an altitude of 7,000 feet, but even at this great height fair crops of wheat and barley are raised—particularly Irish potatoes, which grow here in all their exuberant perfection. There being no possible limits to one's mental travel, we will now skip back to St. Johns, take a fresh start in a westerly direction for a distance of fourteen miles, bringing us to the Concho creek upon which is located the oldest settlement in Apache county. The Concho has its head in a small lake two or three miles above the settlement, and after a sinuous course through vale and canyon, for a distance of twenty miles, empties into the Little Colorado river. Forty miles further in a south-westerly direction, we arrive at the Showlow creek having an altitude of 5,000 feet, yet producing good crops of the cereals. From Showlow creek going south in a southerly direction a distance of eighteen miles, we reach the village of Taylor; here are some of the finest farming lands in Apache county. Still continuing north four miles, the town of Snowflake is reached, where it is to be seen a prosperous farming community. At this place was first located the county-seat of Apache county, but at the first (special) election held June 2, 1879, seat of the county government was, by a vote of the people, moved to St. Johns. Still traveling in a northerly direction, from the last named place, for a distance of thirty-five miles, we arrive at the Atlantic & Pacific Railway. Holbrook and its vicinity possesses great possibilities, but as yet they are undeveloped; located here also, is the headquarters of one of the largest cattle and land companies in the Territory of Arizona, viz: the Atace Land & Cattle Company. This company own half a million acres of land upon which the company now have 40,000 head of cattle, besides several hundred head of horses. Capt. James H. Simpson is the General Manager and Mr. Henry Kinsley the Secretary and Asst. Treasurer of the company, having their residences at Holbrook. The principal offices of the company however, are in the city of New York. Along the valley of the Little Colorado from Holbrook as far down the river as the mouth of the Black River, are many thousands of acres of very fair farming lands, but owing to the high banks of the river and other physical difficulties, it necessitates too great an expense to take out water for purposes of irrigation.

APACHE COUNTY.

To particularize a little, I will say of the Concho creek, and the immediate vicinity of St. Johns, that they produce much fruit, viz: apples, peaches, plums, apricots, grapes, strawberries, and other fruits. However, the principal industry of Apache county is in its infancy, but a few years hence, an abundance will have been grown, sufficient to supply home consumption, leaving a large surplusage for exportation. It will be remembered in this connection, that the whole of Apache county is an elevated plateau, with an altitude ranging from 4,000 feet in the northwest, up to 7,000 feet in the southeast.

APACHE COUNTY.

In eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, the first year of Apache county, the total amount of assessable property amounted to only three hundred thousand dollars; and, as one decade of its existence has passed away, I will now briefly summarize the changes which have taken place in that time. It is well known that in the creation of the county of Graham, that the half of its territory was taken from Apache county; nevertheless, our assessable property to-day foots up to the magnificent sum of 3,000,000 dollars. The "floating" and bonded indebtedness of the county is but a few thousand dollars, and the county's finances are in an exceedingly healthy condition to-day; its warrants are taken at par by the banks, and they now have an upward trend of no room for doubt but in a year, or two years at most, our "floating" and bonded debt will be entirely wiped out.

APACHE COUNTY.

Although more or less farming is carried on in this county, nevertheless the principal industries are those of stock growing; with the cattle and sheep interests about an equal footing. The year just drawing to a close, has been an extra good one for the sheep and wool producers, therefore the prospects for the future are quite jubilant over the present and future good prospects in their line of business. As for the cattle interests, the year just past, like the two preceding ones, has not been such as to please the breeders, but the general opinion is, that they have every reason to feel confident that the present bad outlook for their particular commodity will surely change for the better and this, too, in the near future. It is hardly possible to give a full and complete account of the changes in the beef-markets in the east can give into a worse condition than now, and in which they have been for the past two or three years.

APACHE COUNTY.

The light losses, comparatively speaking, by all classes of stock growers in this county during the past winter, has kept all of them in good humor and spirits notwithstanding the heavy losses, owing to the extra severe cold weather, in New Mexico, Montana, Wyoming, and Idaho, and perhaps elsewhere, which were in many instances as high as fifty per centum, the losses in this county did not exceed ten per centum all around.

A Big Reservoir. The Florence canal is now completed to within five miles of the railroad. The big reservoir will cover an area of 300 acres, and will have a capacity of over eight feet of water over the entire area. The embankments will be twenty feet wide at the top. The main canal running from the Gila river will empty into this reservoir, which is located several miles from the canal. After all the land tributary to the canal, which lies between the reservoir and the river, has been irrigated, the surplus water will pass into the reservoir. During the rainy season of both winter and summer the reservoir will be seen filled with the surplus. Leading from this great reservoir is the canal being constructed, which will bring many thousands of acres under cultivation. It is quite evident that the Florence canal people know what they are about. The cost of the construction of this reservoir will be \$125,000.
