THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DRIFTS. Foul of a Ship. A Settlement Between the Seligman and the Donohue Road. J. F. Burgin Jr., President of the San Francisco and North Pacific Railroad, accompanied by C. P. Hutton, attorney for the same road, arrived here on last evening's overland train, after a month's sojourn in New York City. Mr. Burgin was seen by the Morning Call on his arrival at the Oakland ferry. In regard to his trip he said:

"I have had a pleasant trip, but I must say that the best part of it is in getting used to this climate. People who had found with a little fog and talk about the winds of San Francisco ought to spend the month of July in New York. The climate is just what we need here. After an experience of this kind I am sure they will give up with me the idea of coming to California. We have had very little time for pleasure during our absence, and did not leave the city, devoting every hour to the adjustment of the road.
