HER LAST VOYAGE.

The Lacoda Condemned and Sold at Yokohama.

A Leak Sprang Which Could Not Be Stopped.

Mutiny of the Crew on the High Seas—The Whaling Fleet.

The steamer Rio de Janeiro, which arrived from Yokohama yesterday, brought three of the crew of the whaling bark Lacoda, including three of the mates.

The Lacoda will never again make another trip to the Arctic, the story of her last voyage is a most interesting one, carrying with it a long contest between the crew and the captain regarding the navigation.

The Lacoda left this port on a whaling voyage at the opening of the season, but had not long been under way when a leak was sprung.

The leak increased so that all hands were required at the pumps. In the Yellow Sea the leakage became frightful, the double pumps being used and the pumping continuing steadily thirty minutes every two hours.

So dangerous became the situation that Captain Leake was compelled to put into Vladivostok, Siberia, where an endeavor was made to locate the leak.

The vessel was found to be leaking from her bottom in a terrible condition. Captain Leake did what he could for his vessel and prepared to proceed on his whaling journey.
