REVOLUTIONARY.

Dr. Pond Criticized by Congregational Ministers.

His Increment of Dr. Dunning Leads to a Spirited Discussion—Other Denominational Conventions.

Rev. Dr. Pond created a sensation in the meeting of the Congregational Club yesterday by reading a paper indorsing a recent article from the pen of Dr. Dunning, published in the Andover Review.

The theme chosen was "The Reorganization of the Congregational Church," and it was called to the fact that the differences had arisen in regard to questions of government, and that there are not enough ministers in the pulpits; that the ministry is the brightest minds of the young men of the country, and that the increase in the ministry is due in great part to secessions from other denominations, notably the Methodist.

To rectify these evils Dr. Dunning had suggested a plan which presented four points: First, larger salaries; second, more orders in the ministry; third, a more thorough division and subdivision of the field, and fourth, competent direction of the forces employed to manage the work.

Dr. Pond thought this was in accord with the apostolic plan. There was but one church in the town of Corinth, and one at the large city of Ephesus. By adopting this plan the ministry would be rendered more attractive for able young men, and soon there would be no post-terrestrial churches and the church would be reformed.

The speaker believed that this could be accomplished without sacrificing any of the elements of congregationalism. The people of the church would still be ruled. In this he believed in the nation as well as the church. He thought the Government should own and control all things that are to be made the subject of monopoly, such as railroads, telegraph lines.

To illustrate his idea, he said he would like to go to a place like Skisikon County single handed and enter the work there, but if he could be the pastor of a church extending over the whole county, with all the congregations in different parts, with an army of twenty-five men to help him, he would feel like undertaking the job.

When the Rev. Dr. Pond's paper was read, Rev. Mr. Rowell said that few ministers are able to satisfy one congregation. He thought they would find it more difficult to please a dozen or twenty congregations. The plan is contrary to congregationalism, he maintained.

Rev. Mr. Kimball thought the doctrine of the Street Committee was a heresy, and is to be considered the boss church in San Francisco and which the substratum.

Professor Moore thought the plan might be applied to the details of work within any congregation, but as a scheme for general reorganization it should be rejected.

"I am surprised to see Dr. Pond get so much off his congregational legs," said Rev. Mr. Frer. said he wanted to be Archbishop of Skisikon County himself and therefore could not join in Dr. Pond's proposition.

Rev. Mr. Williams was confident that something must be done to save congregationalism, as it is withering, dying. Rev. Dr. Allen said he had to serve in preference to any he ever saw. He served under a Bishop in the Episcopal church for twenty-five years and never saw a congregational camp in order to rid himself of his duties. He had no thought of going backward.

Rev. Mr. Pullen was amused to see that what he had followed Dr. Dunning in his new law.

Professor Benton, amid much laughter, explained that all his work would be done by the introduction of telephones, when Dr. Pond said he had no objection to the seat of Skisikon County and his sermon could be read by the congregations in all the cities of the world.

Rev. Mr. Wyckoff said he could not fail to recognize the effectiveness of the plan, but he could not see where the money was to come from. He was fearful that not only all the members of the church would be to be the members of the church, but that they would be to be the members of the church.

ALONG THE RAIL.

The New Schedule Not Favored by the Union Pacific.

A Death-Row to the Tourist Excursion Business—Pullman Put Off His Sleeping-Car—Heavy Travel Premised.

The joint time schedule recently agreed upon at Ogden by officials of the Southern Pacific, Union Pacific, Denver and Rio Grande and other lines does not seem to please at least one party to the contract, and for some unknown reason the Union Pacific has refused to make passenger connections at Ogden with the Southern Pacific second-class train, which by the new time-table leaves this city at 7:30 o'clock in the morning.

The train referred to now arrives at Ogden at 7 o'clock in the morning, Pacific time, or 8 o'clock mountain time. The Union Pacific train leaves Ogden at 6:30 o'clock in the morning morning mountain time, or about an hour and a half before the Southern Pacific train arrives. By this strange combination of routes passengers are obliged to remain in Ogden overnight.

General Agent here knows nothing of the affair, further than the facts above stated. He has not even been asked to make passenger connections at Ogden with the Southern Pacific second-class train, which by the new time-table leaves this city at 7:30 o'clock in the morning.

AN END TO TOURIST CARES.
