

A FREE FIGHT.

Exciting Encounter in a Spokane Falls Court-Room.

The Outcome of a Conflict Between City and Judicial Authorities.

Short but Lively Bout Between the Mayor and Three Attorneys—A Scene of Wild Confusion.

SPokane Falls, Dec. 4.—Judge Blake's court in the Superior Court was the scene today of an exciting free fight, in which Mayor Clough, Attorneys Turner, Graves and Flynn and the officers of the court participated. For a few moments there was a tremendous uproar. The fight was the result of a conflict between the city and judicial authorities. Judge Blake rendered a judgment against the city for \$200, in favor of ex-Police Justice Currier. Mayor Clough refused to sign the warrant and was arrested for contempt of court. Charles S. Voorhes, attorney for the city, in addressing the court said it was an outrage that the Mayor should be summarily arrested on a charge the penalty of which was imprisonment in the penitentiary. Attorney George Turner, a prominent politician, retorted that it might have been better for the city if the whole municipal Government had been in the penitentiary for the past two years.

After the court adjourned and while the men were leaving the court, Mayor Clough approached Turner and said that his remarks were uncalled for, and that his law firm had been mixed up in every dirty case with the city. Turner then struck Clough. Some say the blow was a hard one, while others that he dodged the blow and fell over a chair, and Turner jumped upon the prostrate man. Theron Attorney Quinn sought to pull Clough away from Turner's former law partner, then jumped on Quinn. The Sheriff, deputies and constables then rushed in. The Judge pounded on the bar and the men went into confusion generally. Finally the combatants were separated and it was found that Clough was badly hurt. Turner served as United States Marshal in Alabama under Grant's Administration and was one of the men who investigated Grant in the Chicago convention.

THE ILLI ASSASSINATION. Preliminary Examination of August Osen on a Charge of Murder.

A Delightful Calm in the Cyclone's Wake.

Yesterday was an ideal winter day of San Francisco after a rain-storm. The air was fresh and wholesome and the mild temperature exhilarating.
