THE REVOLUTION TRIUMPHANT.

On Wednesday last, on receipt of the news of the battle of Alconagua, THE CALL observed that "in a day or two, the Constitutionalists will fight their way into the city of Valparaiso, and the demoralization of the Government forces will result from the capture of the province. The appearance of their flag in the streets will lead to a general stampede among Balmeada's troops."

The prediction was verified two days afterward, on Friday, the 28th. The only variations in the programme was that the conflict was precipitated by Balmeada's forces. It seems that General Canoto at the railroad, runs from Valparaiso to Santiago, was the Government army commander. The Balmeada army was alternative to endeavor to regain possession of the road, so as to restore their connections. It may also be surmised that the army was not so much a military force, surrounded by a population that was either hostile or lukewarm. Impelled by these incentives, Balmeada's army moved out of the city of Valparaiso, and they met themselves on Canoto's intrenchments. The operation can only have been inspired by despair. A line of works, defended by an inferior force, armed with modern weapons, cannot exist, unless the attacking force is on foot, unless the defenders of the line are seized with a panic and run away. But it will probably turn out that Canoto's position could not be turned, his rear was covered by hills, and every eminence was probably crowned with guns. The Balmeada's had to attack the intrenchments in front, if they were going to attack at all. They did so, and, as was inevitable, they were hurled back with frightful slaughter. Their two leading generals being left on the ground.

The moment they turned to fly Canoto's troops leaped the intrenchments and followed in hot pursuit, while their artillery maintained their fire from the heights. The weather was cloudy and rainy, and the condition of the atmosphere will continue to be unfavorable. It is expected that a storm of moderate intensity will continue in the latter part of the week. The following rainfalls have been reported: Eureka, 2.00 inch, 28th; San Francisco, 1.50 inch, 29th; San Jose, 1.00 inch, 29th. Forecast till 8 P. M. Sunday. Light rain in Northern Nevada; winds generally south to west; nearly every mountain peak in the region snow-capped; cooler in Northern Nevada; fog and clouds along the coast.
