STRUCK BY A TRAIN. A Brewery Wagon Run Down by the Monterey Express.

An Accident at the Twenty-fifth Street Crossing—Henry Bahman Fatally Hurt and His Team Killed.

Henry Bahman, a driver employed by the San Francisco Stock Brewery, was run down by a Southern Pacific train yesterday and seriously, perhaps fatally, injured. He was struck by the train at the Twenty-fifth street crossing, and attempted to cross the railroad track. The team was struck by the Monterey express as it was booming in around a curve.

Bohman was thrown high into the air and to one side of the track, where he lay in an unconscious condition. Scattered around him were fragments of the wagon, while on the other side of the track lay the two horses. The one next to the engine was mangled and the other had its leg broken and was afterward shot.

The unfortunate driver was picked up by Officer Harry Moran and conveyed to the City and County Hospital, where it was found that he had received serious injuries. The right side of his face was crushed and

his right arm was broken. It was also thought that his skull was fractured and that he had received a fatal injury. After treatment by Resident Physician Bradbury, Bohman recovered his faculties, and the injured man, with his wife and two children at 1255 Francisco street. He was considered a careful driver, and had been in the employ of the brewery for five years.

Several persons who witnessed the affair say that the bell on the engine was not rung when the driver was struck, and that the team and wagon lifted bodily over the engine's smokestack.
