

ANOTHER FIELD DAY

In Judge Murphy's Court Over the Bell Case.

His Honor Refers to a Witness as "a Creature"—The Examiner's "Peeping Tom" on the Stand—Campbell's Last Retraction.

The motion of Sidney Bell's counsel for a continuance of the trial yesterday by a new trial was granted by Judge Murphy, who said that the testimony of the witness in the case was so contradictory that he was unable to believe it.

DECLARES HIMSELF A PERJURER

Schmidt was very nervous and excited. He made a statement in which he declared himself a perjurer and said that he had lied in his testimony.

Mr. Brady asked for the return of the original notes made by the witness, claiming that the copies provided to the court were not accurate.

JUDGE MURPHY REFUSED TO MAKE THE ORDER

Judge Murphy refused to make the order for the return of the original notes, stating that the copies were sufficient for the trial.

LOOKING FOR TRUTH

Witness further admitted that he thought Brown would be guilty of great felony while acting as a detective in the information case.

THE KIP AFFIDAVIT
