RAILROAD COMMISSIONERS.

The Southern Pacific Company's
Answer to Shively.

Complaint Dismissed at the Next Meeting—
Other Grievances Filed.

The great \$12,000,000 year trinity, known as
the Board of Railroad Commissioners, was
in session yesterday morning, and as usual
did not do anything important.

It was expected that the legal battle between
the attorney of Mr. Shively and the Southern Pacific
Company would be continued, but soon after Chairman
Rea called the meeting to order it was
learned there would be no such fight during
that session.

After the reading of the minutes of the
previous meeting, Secretary Kelly read
the amended complaint of Mr. Shively, in which he
withdraws his objections to the schedule of
all the other roads...

Commissioner Litchfield moved that the
board defer action on the amended complaint
until the next meeting, which motion
was carried.

On being asked later by Attorney Kelly,
who appeared for Shively, why he did
not delay his motion, he explained that
he was not sure that he would move to dismiss
the complaint until the other roads
together with that against the other roads
and that he desired time to consider the
matter.

"I consider the figures quoted in the
complaint decidedly unfair and calculated
to injure the Southern Pacific Company,"
said Commissioner Litchfield, who then
continued by declaring that he had
thoroughly examined these schedules at the
last meeting, and that he had found
the figures correct enough, but had
discovered that the selections were unfair
and that the figures were not a true
showing of the state of affairs.

"This kind of evidence has no weight
with me," said Commissioner Litchfield,
"looking a combined picture of injured
industry and indignation."

Attorney Kelly briefly replied that if
the schedules were wrong the investigation
asked for would bring that fact to light.

He admitted that the figures on
file with the commission, but maintained
that he had done so in good faith and
without any intention of defrauding
the public.
