

MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

Personnel of the Next California Delegation. THREE REPUBLICANS ARE PREPARED.

Hilborn, Loud and Bowers appear to have been Successful—The Democrats Gain Two Members.

The returns from the Congressional districts show that the Democracy has gained two members, and that they now have a majority of California's delegation.

Maguire and Cannon have been returned from the First, Second, Fourth and Sixth districts, respectively, by good majorities leaving the Third with Hilborn, the Fifth with Loud and the Seventh with Bowers to the Republicans.

In all these districts the customary Republican majorities have been greatly reduced, and some doubt has been expressed as to the success of Loud and Hilborn. There seems, however, to be no occasion for this.

CRIMMINS IS CRUSHED.

He and Kelly are Completely Routed. THE NON-PARTISANS DID IT.

A Sad Lot of People in the Neighborhood of Third and Market Streets Just About Now.

At 10 o'clock yesterday morning the Kelly-Crimmins-De Young crowd practically gave up the municipal fight and acknowledged that every candidate on their ticket was honestly beaten.

The Non-Partisans were not asleep. As fast as the heeled reached the booths where the counting was in progress two or more Morse detectives met them and went on duty until the last vote was counted.

Kelly and Crimmins have lost in bets alone over \$500, while Mike De Young has lost at least \$100,000.

Let us suppose, he added, "that the Democracy of this city were every man on the ticket, which is not probable; even then the work of the Non-Partisans has been worth thousands, tens of thousands, yes, hundreds of thousands of dollars to this city."

There was no wild-eyed enthusiasm among the Non-Partisan headquarters during the day. Not once did any man who felt the least bit blue.

Reports would come in that O'Donnell was hundreds of votes ahead, and the men who have made San Francisco what it is would smile and say, "That's all right, Eliot will win. Don't worry, and then go to their business, only to come back to receive later news with the same smiling countenance."

Whatever else THE CALL has done it has proved to the people the rottenness of the Kelly-Crimmins-De Young movement, and the people, in return, have expressed their condemnation of the men and their methods.
