Doctors in Court on a Case of Quarantine.

A LONE TRAMP'S SUICIDE.

Two Men Dead and Unknown—Highwaymen at Work in the Country—A Disastrous Fire.

There were half a score of doctors in Department of the Superior Court yesterday to testify as to whether the little daughter of William Roberts has smallpox or only the chickenpox.

The house at 480 Twentieth street was quarantined a few days ago, and the father had difficulty in getting out to work. He broke locks, however, and succeeded in getting in his ballot, but was soon found and put back by Health Officer Dunn.

Dr. Pinkerton, who had treated the case before the Health Officer was summoned, told Roberts that the child was afflicted with chickenpox, and had others to make an examination who gave a like diagnosis.

The judge stated that he believed they were all sincere, but decided that he should have to deny the writ unless the counsel for petitioner should see fit to ask for a dismissal.

HE HAD NO FAULT TO FIND,

But a Thousand Thanks for Brave Firemen.

The Rescue of People From a Burning Building—A Gracious Compliment for Chief Scannell and His Men.

The average citizen who goes about his business from day to day in the United States is so accustomed to the blessings of fire insurance that he seldom awakens to a realizing sense that they are actual, potential and substantial blessings. It is only when something happens out of the ordinary run which jeopardizes one's life or limb, or when one is suddenly deprived of some accustomed privilege that there is an awakening to this great truth.

If a citizen be unfortunate enough to be knocked down and run over on the street he will regret the appearance of the patrol wagon and its officers to bear him away to the City Receiving Hospital with the same degree of grateful regard with which the shipwrecked sailor contemplates the rescuing lifeboat and its crew.

If a citizen discover his house on fire there is nothing in the world so cheering to him as the quick descent upon his premises of the firemen with their steam engines, trucks and hose carts. He then becomes suddenly conscious that the city which maintains these men and appliances is something more to him and his household than an abstraction.

Generally after a fire where people have been in extreme peril and have been rescued by the firemen, no more is heard of them and hardly so much as a word of thanks is uttered to the gallant men. This, no doubt, is largely due to the fact that the firemen have been too much terrified at the time to be courteous to their deliverers.

An exception is noted in the case of the fire in the old St. Ignace College building on Market street shortly after midnight on Saturday.

The building was filled with smoke before the inmates of the upper floor knew the basement was on fire. The firemen had reached the building before these people were aware of their peril and they were rescued by the firemen.
