Warning Little Ones Away From Disease. Young Lives are in Danger. Cesspools in the Vicinity of the Sherman Primary School Menacing to Health.

"I have a police whistle," said Miss Hawley, principal of the Sherman Primary School on Union street, "and when I see any of the little ones going near the cesspools, as they have been trained not to do, my whistle drives them quickly away."

A reporter of THE CALL visited the locality yesterday afternoon and found that the condition of affairs in the vicinity of the Sherman Primary School is simply disastrous.

The school is built within a few feet of the line of Union street on a rising ground, with the front facing eastward. At the foot of this rising ground is an open ditch containing foul-smelling sewage, which makes its way sluggishly through a box culvert under Union street into a large open cesspool on the north side of the street and east of Franklin street.

The stench from this disease-breeding cesspool can be smelt a considerable distance away, and when the wind is blowing from the northeast it is carried to the primary school and adjacent buildings.

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

The Pool Near the School. new Franklin-street sewer, and which the sewer has not covered. This explanation is partly confirmed by the fact that the ditch, which had been open since it existed before the sewer was constructed.

This is not the only open cesspool marring the health of the children at the primary school. On the east side of Franklin street, on the opposite side of the street from the school, is another cesspool filled with greenish, slimy water. It is exactly on a line with the front of the school, and is unquestionably an active source of danger to the health of the children.

The water in this cesspool was primarily part of the sewage from the district to the south of Union street, and which, after filling up of the brick sewer, been kept fully supplied by rain water, as it has never been connected with the main sewer.

What the property-owners urgently demand is that these fever-breeding cesspools, which mangle the health of the school children, be filled up. About a month ago Miss Hattman, who lived in cottage No. 412 on Franklin street, died of typhoid fever, and the doctor does not hesitate to say that she contracted the disease from the cesspools referred to.


The ground floor of the schoolroom is utilized as a storeroom and for ventilating purposes. The first and second floors are used as classrooms. The first floor is about twenty feet above the level of Union street. Above the level of the school, facing Union street, the ground slopes down and here the grade of the street is about four feet above the level of the school. There is an entrance here from the street, but it has been rendered useless owing to the raising of the grade of the street.

Inquiries were made of several of the residents and it was ascertained that within the past three or four months several children attending the primary school have been suffering from sore throat, to put it as mildly as possible, but some were more outspoken and called the sore throat diphtheria.

Parents will not allow their children to attend school as long as the cesspools are allowed to remain in their present condition. And there is no earthly reason why they should not be filled up. One of the property-owners, in speaking of this sewer, said: "I believe really that the cesspools have been the cause of the cholera epidemic of last year, and that the cholera epidemic of last year was caused by the cesspools."

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
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
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
