A TIDAL COMBER. The Gwynthern Castle Is Nearly Swamped. A HOUSE FALLS IN THE BAY. Shipowners Trying to Sign Boarding-House Crews for the Coming Summer Season.

From San Jose state that the British ship Gwynthern Castle reports having been nearly swamped by a tidal wave at sea during her voyage to Raiglen on January 21. The sea was perfectly smooth, and gave no evidence of any disturbance. At 7 A. M. when the vessel was about 100 miles from Raiglen, a tremendous swell of water was observed to be rolling toward the ship.
