WONG DIP KEN.

Likely Soon to Start on His Return to China.

LOS ANGELES, July 3.—The case of Wong Dip Ken, the Chinaman sentenced to be deported, came up to-day before United States Judge Ross, the court having overruled the motion to dismiss the appeal from the decision of Commissioner Van Dyke.

The Chinaman's counsel read a long assignment of errors on appeal, and moved the court to set aside the judgment and discharge the appellant because the commissioner had no jurisdiction to make such a judgment, because several sections of the act are unconstitutional and void.

The court in its speech laid special emphasis on the unconstitutionality of that clause of the Geary law providing that Chinese convicted may be imprisoned previous to deportation.

In reply to a question from the court he said he thought that if it is conceded that the clause relating to imprisonment is invalid that invalidates other parts of the section.

The court was of different opinion, holding that in such a case other clauses may be held entirely good.

The court then denied motions for another hearing and a new trial, and the United States attorney made a strong argument on the other side, showing that if this clause was declared unconstitutional the Chinese would have to be deported the moment they were convicted, which would generally be impracticable.
