A MODEL FOR A FOUNTAIN. Canadian Citizens Taking Action Regarding the Midwinter Fair.

Napa Ladies at Work.

E. Cawston of Los Angeles, who has obtained the concession for an ostrich farm at the Midwinter Exposition, was at the grounds near Concert Valley yesterday trying to select a site for his space of 150 square feet.

On their arrival at Teal station, which is located on the railroad right-of-way, they were approached by Bouncer Chittenden, who came "armed and eager for the fray."

Mr. Cawston has made arrangements with an incubating company, so that if his birds fail to lay and hatch during the progress of the exposition the eggs will be hatched in the incubator and people will have an opportunity of seeing the ostrich chicks when they are first turned out.

A beautiful statuary representation of the Midwinter Fair, California, comprising a design for a large fountain to be placed in the exposition grounds, has been secured by Theodore Bacglalupi.

On either side of the gateway is a rocky promontory on which figures of typical California girls are seated in a row.

A STEP FORWARD. The Rehabilitation of a Savings Bank.

AN INCREASE OF CAPITAL. The People's Home to Conduct Business on Liberal Lines After November 1.

The most important action taken by the directors of the People's Home Savings Bank since that institution temporarily suspended in June was the resolution adopted yesterday at the meeting of the board.

In fact, it means the entire rehabilitation of the bank, and steps are now being considered by which it will be made stronger than ever.

On November 1 the bank will resume business regularly. On that date commercial depositors will be paid in full, and notices will be regularly accepted from savings depositors.

The making of collections has, too, but just commenced, and while this amount has been raised, collections that in the aggregate are many times as large have been commenced, and with what is now in sight the amount in hand will be almost doubled before the first of next month.

It has been decided to pay commercial depositors in full if they desire it, as most of these deposits are in the hands of business men, who may need the money in a commercial way, and whose deposits one day will balance the drafts of a former one.

The managers of the institution are well satisfied with the result of the first attempt at reopening the bank. The run lasted only three days, and in all less than one-fourth of the total number of depositors have made any demand for their share of the corporation's assets.

In speaking of the matter one of the directors said: "We have waited long enough to see what the public mind in commercial circles is entirely over and money is now much easier than during the summer. If it should become necessary, we could dispose of some of our securities at a profit."

The much-discussed consolidation of the principal street railways of this city has been taken place, an agreement having been reached by the representatives of the various lines yesterday.

Included in the corporation are the Market-street cable system, Market-street and Fairmont, Park and Ocean Railroad, Potrero and Bay View, Southern Heights and Visitation Valley, City Railway Company, Central Railway Company, Omnibus Railway Company, North Beach and Mission, and Cliff House.
