

DISABLED AT SEA.

Accident to the Steamer Laguna. The Iwanhoe Short-handed. Tugs to Out in Search of the Miowra—Two Boats and Several Boys Rescued.

Quite a serious accident occurred to the steamer Laguna while bound from this port for Uval. The Laguna left here on the 12th, and when about three miles off Rockport, Mendocino County, at 12 o'clock on the 13th a bolt in her cylinder-head gave way, for a while placing the vessel at the mercy of the waves. The Laguna's machinery was pretty badly wrecked, and sail had to be relied upon to keep the steamer off the rocks. A signal of distress was raised. An inbound vessel sighted it and brought word to San Francisco. At noon on Saturday the tug Monarch started after the disabled steamer.

The Monarch towed the Laguna to Westport, but the sea was so rough that an attempt to make harbor was abandoned and the steamer, by aid of the Monarch, was brought back to San Francisco yesterday afternoon.

The selection of survivors regardless of their standing with the union or non-union factions by the Black Diamond Coal Company did not pass off so quietly as was expected in the case of the ship Iwanhoe. She sailed for Astoria on Sunday last, but she did not start. Eight of her crew, but her original crew stayed with her, but three of the four new men selected deserted her just as she was ready for sea. It is stated that the four men were union sailors, but if so they were not shipped through the union office.
