A BOLD PLUNGE.

Attempted Escape of a Sailor. He Jumped Overboard from the Ship Springburn Twice—Changes on the Saturn.

The determined efforts of a seaman of the British ship Springburn to escape from thrall-dom when that vessel was being towed to sea yesterday created a sensation at section 1 of the seal, on board the revenue cutter Hartley and on the pilot-boat, the back on the Saturn.

The Springburn was in tow of the tug Relief and was just opposite the grain sheds when a man was seen to jump overboard from her. Scarcely had the fellow struck the water when Malcolm Gately, who, with a companion, was passing near by in a whitehall, started to the rescue.

Almost simultaneously the Grace S lowered a boat, and the Hartley, which was steaming for Meigs wharf, also joined in the race.

The boat from the Grace S reached the swimmer, pulled him out of the water, and took him back to the ship. The Springburn then signaled to the Relief to commence towing again.

Just as the tug and her tow were rounding the seawall the same sailor made a rush for the port rail of the ship and jumped over again. This time Boatman Gately got to him first, and he was taken to the shore as hard as he could row.

The Hartley started after Gately, and overhauling him took the would-be deserter away from the tug. He made no further attempt to get ashore.

Wilbur of the steamer Saturn has resigned his position and has been succeeded by a Mr. Stoen, late of the Pacific Mail Company. The resignation was accepted by the company, provided her crew agrees to sign articles which read that they shall serve for a continuous period of one year, or until the company shall be satisfied to discharge them.
