She Returns to Confront Litigation.

STATE TROOPS ON WHEELS.

Mr. and Mrs. Walsh Asked to Account for a Fortune.

AN ACME MAN'S FAST RIDE.

Ainsworth Executors Ask Permission to Rent Valuable Broadway Property.

Oakland.—The widow of the late Dr. Poulson, the Fruitvale spiritualist, is expected to return to this city from Council Bluffs, Iowa, where the doctor recently died of fatty degeneration of the heart.

The litigation is sure to be involved from the fact that the half dozen suits brought against the property left by Dr. Poulson will clash with the suits of title which are threatened by the daughter, Deborah, and the doctor's son, Hiram.

The property, which is valued at \$100,000, has already been attached by three sets of lawyers, who seek to recover counsel fees.

Miss Harrington's judgment for malpractice will also be entered. Besides, there are any number of minor claims.

The problem of title will be difficult of solution. The estate, which at one time included the Fruitvale Sanitarium and real estate in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Council Bluffs and in various parts of Iowa, is claimed by Hiram on the ground of deeds made out by the doctor to him with the purpose of offsetting the wife's filing of a homestead.

Subsequently the doctor made out other deeds, which nullified the ones to Hiram. Some of these were recorded and some were not. Hiram was variously represented in these deeds as the doctor's "son" and "brother."

No will has been as yet found at Council Bluffs, nor at the Fruitvale Sanitarium, which was on Tuesday searched for that purpose.

It is stated on the authority of Mr. Staples, Mrs. Poulson's attorney, that Dr. Poulson two years ago made two wills in succession and deposited them at the Oakland Bank of Savings. The bank officials will not make known the contents of the deposit-box.

A Military Innovation. Oakland is known as the wheeling center of the coast and now has on foot a scheme whereby it will have made still another step in advance in this respect.

An adjunct to the State militia there is about to be organized a cycle corps to act in conjunction with the regular army. This corps will consist of some seventy-five wheelmen, and steps have already been taken which it is thought will insure the success of the movement.

Under the same terms already laid down in the regular army and which is a part of the militia in New York, Pennsylvania and Illinois. The Oakland corps will be one of the first organized on this coast.

This meeting is called for the purpose of discussing the advisability of having an inspector or some measure of protection against the prevalent disease of tuberculosis.
