

FISH, NOT OPIUM.

A Seizure That Was Not Made.

ON THE SCHOONER ELWOOD.

How the Revenue Men Watched Her With Care.

A SECOND OFFICER KILLED.

Sad Accidents on the Steamer Empire and Ship Fannie Kerr—A Bottle With a History.

All was fish that came to the nets of the Custom-house searchers who looked for opium on board of the schooner Elwood. Instead of finding thirty tons of the drug, the officers found 75,000 pounds of halibut. Now they are feeling very sad.

The brightest dream of the revenue service turned into a nightmare when the Elwood arrived from Vancouver last Saturday. For it was thought that she was suspected of having on board one of the largest consignments of poppy extract that was ever heard of, even in the palmy days of Whalley & Co.

About thirty days ago a gentleman residing in Seattle and doing business by proxy in San Francisco got angry because he was a successful shipper of opium packages, and decided to turn evidence and give the Government a tip. He talked a good deal about his tip, with the result that a vigilant Custom-house man got wind of his story and wired to San Francisco to look for schooners, or something to that effect.

Later advice was received at the Federal building that the Elwood would perhaps go to land a cargo of fish at some place on the coast. The vessel was not very well known on the Sound and was described as a "queer craft" of great size.

Still later came a dispatch saying that there was supposed to be an immense consignment of opium on the schooner. The Custom-house officers said nothing, but plan for a seizure that would startle the city.

When the Elwood left Vancouver and started for the United States waters she was suddenly pounced upon by the United States steamer Adams and searched. Nothing was found but halibut and fish, so the Adams officers said nothing, but took a fish or two, but declined an offer of ice, remarking that the weather was somewhat chilly with them just at that particular time.

The Elwood sheered off and started south. Suddenly the Ranger or some other United States ship loomed up and made a beeline, but she was searched again. More fish—no opium.

In the meantime the office at San Francisco was not inactive. Captain Wells, the well-known seaman who has his headquarters at Section 4 of the seawall, was employed to go to Point Reyes in a small boat to stand guard and report if a vessel like the Elwood should put in on the coast. Captain Wells got his little craft, a full decked fishing smack, ready and started off for the point, braving the dangers of the tremendous seas off that projection, and virtually risking his life to serve his country and his flag.

The captain's persistence was about the most interesting circumstance of any of those in the Custom-house employ, for a sail to Point Reyes in a little boat is a risky undertaking. For weeks the vessel was watched, but the schooner did not come.

When the Elwood docked at Fisherman's wharf she was watched by a whole lot of inspectors, who went through her carefully and argued with her commander. At the meeting of the Board of Harbor Commissioners yesterday afternoon Engineer Holmes' plans for operating the hoisting gear for Dunsmuir's new coal bunkers were discussed, and it was decided that Chandler's bunkers at Pacific wharf will have to go next, as the best device to use the wharf for the purpose of docking a big steamer.

William Arman, a member of the crew of the British ship Fannie Kerr, at present in the stream, fell from aloft yesterday morning while handling a coil of rope. The unfortunate man was badly injured and cannot recover. He was removed to the City Receiving Hospital.

Private letters received yesterday give the catch of the following sealers: Penelope 238 skins, Louis Oyer 600, H. C. Wahlberg 128, the Mattie Oyer was spoken by the Fishery with 262 seals. The vessel was had to put into Hakodate for provisions, as those she obtained when she fitted out at San Pedro were worthless and had to be thrown away. Her crew were on short rations in consequence.

WON THE TROPHY.

Fields Conquers Maynard in Six Rounds.

Result of an Exciting Bantam-Weight Contest Before the Oakland Acme Club.

Joe Fields won a valuable gold trophy at the Acme Club quarters in Oakland last night by vanquishing F. A. Maynard in a six-round bout. Both men are members of the Oakland club.

The event of the evening was preceded by three clever sets. F. Gilbert of the Olympic Club, amateur champion lightweight of the coast, met C. Brown of the Acme in a three-round bout. Hughes and O. Pickard, both of the Acme, boxed three rounds and the Swain brothers (Acme) gave a clever three-round exhibition.

Fields and Maynard then entered the ring amid loud cheering. Fields weighed in at 107 pounds and Maynard at 105. Jack Kitchen was selected to act as referee. Ike Mosser of Sacramento and Ed Wilcox of the Acme Club were appointed judges. The timers were Pete Williams for Maynard and George F. Neese of the Acme Club for Fields. Both of the bantams were in excellent condition and showed faithful training. In this respect, however, Fields had the better of it.

The sparring in the first round was cautious, the men clinching repeatedly. Maynard showed a disposition to be a little slow at the break-away in the second round. Fields landed heavily on Maynard's right eye, which began to swell. Maynard seemed considerably distressed, but he was not hurt. He was knocked out in the third round, receiving a knock-out blow on the forehead. Both men were aroused by this time and did some vicious hitting.

The remainder of the fight was easily Fields'. He drew blood from Maynard's nose in the fourth round, and in the fifth round he landed a blow on the forehead which caused Maynard to stop. He came to the center at the call of the time in the fifth round, decidedly the freshest of the two. His general condition was excellent.

His general condition was excellent. He stopped Maynard's rushes time after time with a straight left.

Very much like a fowl was executed by Maynard at one time in this round, when he had shoved Fields on to the ropes. The crowd hissed and cheered and the flutters and the boat went on.

In the last round Fields laid everything flat on its back. He was successful in his choice. Maynard clinched to avoid punishment and closed roughly.

The trophy was awarded Fields, Maynard had both eyes closed and his nose and left hand were severely cut. Fields showed a few abrasions on his face and eyes.

Over 400 spectators witnessed the fight and pronounced it a clever and nervy exhibition.

IN A NEW COAT.

Brown Cement Will Be Applied to the Custom-House.

The coat of white plaster which has been applied to the exterior of the Custom-house will be covered with a coat of brown cement. The fish oil with which the bricks are saturated causes it to disintegrate.

As the result of several tests the Collector has found that white cement, a local product, will adhere to the walls and will not be destroyed by the fish oil. The cement is of a color and the Collector has chosen a tint that is nearest the color of the stone of which the Custom-house is constructed.
