PROCLAMATION. STATE OF CALIFORNIA. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. SACRAMENTO, August 4, 1894. WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of California, at its thirtieth session, beginning on the second day of January, A. D. 1893, two-thirds of all the members elected to each of the houses of said Legislature voting in favor thereof, proposed the following amendments to the Constitution of the State of California, to wit:

AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, amending section seven of article three, relative to the right of suffrage.

AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State of California, relating to the formation of new counties.

AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State of California, relating to the formation of new counties.

PROCLAMATION. Boards may prescribe as to the county assessments, and under such rules of notice as the State Board may prescribe to the action of the State Board, to increase or lower the entire assessment roll, or any assessment contained therein, so as to equalize the assessment of the property contained in said assessment roll, and to make the assessment conform to the true value in money of the property contained in said roll; provided, that no Board of Equalization shall raise any mortgage, deed of trust, contract, or other obligation of credit, above its face value. The State Board of Equalization elected in eighteen hundred and ninety-four shall continue in office until their successors, as herein provided for, shall be elected and shall qualify.
