MARY S. OUTFOOTED HER FIELD IN
THE MILE AND A QUARTER
HANDICAP.

The usual Saturday crowd were in attendance at the track yesterday, and in their attempts to wrest the nimble dollar from the wily brokers were fairly successful. Four favorites and a second choice finishing in front aided them in their battle for wealth.

The Pacific stakes for two-year-olds, half a mile dash, with \$1150 to the winner, was the feature of the day's card. After being unfortunate in two of his runs Kowalsky, carrying the colors of the Chicago racing magnate, Ed Corrigan, a very racy-looking son of Isaac Murphy and Derocromet, turned the tables and played monkey pants with his field.

Notwithstanding his former record Corrigan colt was favored throughout the betting. The field was a large one, there being eleven starters, and every tout on the track had a cinch. Torsion, big as a four-year-old, impressed many by the manner in which he warmed up previous to the run and was backed down from 15 to 9 to 1 and run an excellent race at his first attempt, finishing fourth.

Of the other starters Leon L. Rutven and Monitor received the most support. After considerable delay at the post they were sent away to a straggling start, Griffin getting away with Rathborn. Torsion and Leon L. however, soon took the lead, holding it to the stretch. Bergen then passed them with Kowalsky and won easily by five lengths. Leon L. beat Rathborn and Monitor easily for the place and the field.

The mile and a quarter handicap went to Mary S., the favorite, with Griffin up, who won under a pull.

The steeplechase, which was the medium of a hundred different tips, was gathered in by John Field's Relapago, after Willie Spence had nearly thrown the race away in the stretch, allowing Mestor to get so dangerously near that he won by about two inches.

Ferrier, the prohibitive favorite for the last race, won in the commonest kind of a canter.

The opening race at six furlongs was won by the usual favorite, but the betting to 7 to 1 was backed down to 12 to 5, going to the post favorite. The other starters all went back in the betting.

Charles rushed to the front and headed the bunch as they turned down the backstretch. Shortly after he resumed his old track of sulking, and Griffin again took the lead with the favorite, winning with plenty to spare by the margin of a length.

The enigmatical Rear Guard was favorite for the second race, five furlongs, opening at 8 to 5, but closed at 2 to 1. Sligo was the backed horse in the race, closing at the same price.

Reginald, an 8-to-1 chance, made the running in the stretch, where Sligo went to the front and won comfortably by a length. Sligo was a 20-to-1 chance, but Sir Reginald was the favorite.

Mary S. opened a 4-to-5 favorite for the mile and a quarter handicap, with Griffin up, but so much money went into the Carmel colt that it was almost impossible to get a bet against her. Eckert, at 9 to 2, was second choice.

The field was sent away to a good start, with Carmel showing first. Mary S. led past the stand under a pull, but shortly after she was overtaken by the front and headed the bunch as they turned down the backstretch. Shortly after he resumed his old track of sulking, and Griffin again took the lead with the favorite, winning with plenty to spare by the margin of a length.

Square Fellow made a great bluff by taking the first jump in front, and then gracefully retired into the bunch. Three Forks then tried to run away with the race, but as they hit the stretch bill grew weary. Relapago then spurred, taking the lead, and won by a nose from Mestor, simply through his jockey taking matters too easy. Three Forks was third.

Ferrier was on a day had very little chance of getting even on the last race, at least by backing the favorite for Ferrier was a 1 to 3 chance. Realization, San Lucas and Tyro were the favored ones for second place.

APPOINTED BY YOU SEPTEMBER 11, 1894, BEGS
