DISTRICT COURT PROCEEDINGS

Since last report proceedings of district court have become of record as follows:

Guadalupe G. de Torres vs. Francisco Torres, divorce granted plaintiff.

R. L. Shaw vs. Elizabeth Atwell and husband (real name unknown), quiet title in favor of plaintiff.

H. L. Andrews vs. J. A. Gaeb et al, judgment of default, order of sale and decree of foreclosure.

In the matter of appointing members of Torrance County Board of Education, R. G. Roberson and Roy Brown were appointed for a term of four years and Manuel A. Otero and Thos. V. Ludlow for a term of two years.

William Hindi vs. Dionicio Duran, order dissolving and dismissing attachment.

Leo Striegel vs. J. A. Cooper, order by default, judgment in favor of plaintiff in the amount of \$1,936.

Leo G. Striegel vs. J. A. Cooper and Mattie M. Cooper, judgment by default, order of sale and decree of foreclosure.

State of New Mexico vs. Persons and Delinquent Tax List of Torrance County for 1919, Treasurer ordered to sell the properties as provided by law to satisfy the taxes.

E. P. Davies vs. J. R. Smith, case dismissed.

H. C. Williams vs. M. D. Atkinson, order extending time exceptions and file transcript of records in the supreme court.

Alice May vs. Arthur M. May, divorce granted to plaintiff.

Brown Shoe Co. vs. C. B. Hamrick, judgment in favor of plaintiff in the sum of \$157.69 and interest at 6 per cent from April 28, 1921, and costs.

Macario Torres vs. F. C. Krieger, leave granted plaintiff to amend complaint.

The Walter Company vs. H. Rogers and Georgia Rogers, judgment against defendants for deficiency in the sum of \$35.97.

Alejandro Baca and L. A. Rousseau vs. Board of County Commissioners, appeal granted.

B. R. Voss vs. J. R. Fulton and the Mountain State Bank, demurrer overruled and defendant given twenty days in which to plead further.

George H. Buer vs. Bettie G. Buer, divorce granted plaintiff, also real estate in Torrance County.

John W. Minion vs. Maud Minion, divorce granted plaintiff.

Elizabeth Hambrick vs. Alvie Hambrick, divorce granted plaintiff.

F. B. Collins Investment Co. vs. William R. Edwards et al, complaint dismissed without prejudice.

Estancia Savings Bank vs. Cleofes Romero and Arabella B. Romero, judgment in favor of plaintiff in the amount of \$5,558.77, with interest on \$5,020 at 10 per cent from June 4, 1921.

William Hindi vs. Dionicio Duran, order granting appeal to plaintiff.

D. D. Shaw vs. Charles B. Hambrick et al, case dismissed on motion of plaintiff.

William A. Hauser vs. W. R. Edwards and wife, case dismissed on motion of plaintiff.

L. V. Holdridge vs. Alva M. Shockey and wife, case dismissed on motion of plaintiff.

M. B. Condrey vs. Francis Joiner and Donnie Joiner, order foreclosing and to sell property to satisfy the amount of \$2,785.78.

Francisco Fernandez vs. Celestino Garde, judgment against plaintiff in the amount of \$2,570.47.

In re petition for naturalization, James Burguete is admitted to citizenship. The petition of Swan Nelson was continued until next term. The petition of Gustav Phillips was dismissed with permission to file a new one.

W. T. Rawleigh Co. vs. Chas. Noble and W. B. Colbaugh vs. Chas. A. Noble, set for first jury day of next term.

James Brigrance vs. Mary Brigrance, dismissed for want of prosecution.

Petra Hinojos Lueras vs. Alejandro Lueras, dismissed.

Neal Jensen (Jenson Bean Co.) vs. J. M. Acker, defendant given twenty days additional time to answer.

Macario Torres vs. F. C. Krieger et al, defendant given until January 1, 1922, in which to answer plaintiff's amended complaint.

In re the case of D. H. Cowley vs. Bill Lowe, judgment given against defendant and his bondsmen, R. E. Burus and Jack Tracy for \$75.

Mathias G. Freilinger vs. James R. Hickey et al, to quiet title, judgment in favor of plaintiff.

Lloyd S. Miles vs. S. A. Goldsmith et al, to quiet title, judgment in favor of plaintiff.

James Ward vs. Bolen R. Dodson, case abated for failure of plaintiff to file security for costs.

William Hindi vs. Dionicio Duran, order settling bill of exceptions.

H. C. Williams vs. Anna M. Dibert et al, to quiet title, judgment in favor of plaintiff.

Dr. Chas. Edmonston vs. W. A. P. Rickey et al, title quieted in favor of plaintiff.

H. C. Williams vs. M. D. Atkinson, judgment against defendant in the amount of \$260 and \$14.70 costs.

J. B. Read, receiver of the Mountain State Bank vs. W. N. Walpole, judgment against defendant in the amount of \$285.89.
