WASHINGTON LETTER.

From our Regular Correspondent.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14, 1899.

"End the war in the Philippines speedily, or the result will be disastrous to you and to the Republican party." That is the sum and substance of what is being daily dinned into the ears of Mr. McKinley, not by his opponents, but by leading Republicans.

The most striking thing connected with the hearing on trusts, by the Industrial Commission, was a daring and somewhat scandalous attack upon Vice-Chairman Phillips of the Commission, who is connected with an independent oil company in Pennsylvania.

Senator Stewart is a fine specimen of stalwart radicalism in all his views. He never trims on any question, and conservatism is unknown to his mind.

The administration appears to be still determined to leave Gen. Otis in supreme command in the Philippines, although Secretary Root is understood to have recommended a change.




