A farmers organization was effected at Pocomoke on Wednesday under the name of the Peninsula Produce Exchange with W. C. Bromley, business manager, and W. C. Cullen, of this county, secretary and treasurer, which will be operated along lines similar to our Exchange and in all things, we trust, in harmony with it.

That such a result is to be expected goes without saying and we are glad to believe, that a long step has been made in that direction in the selection of the business manager and secretary and treasurer of the Peninsula Produce Exchange of Maryland.

With Mr. Bromley in the former capacity, we are advised, that the Peninsula Exchange will have an intelligent and active business man, thoroughly in earnest in the work which has been assigned him and ready to do all in his power to promote its interest, and that Exchange is surely fortunate in securing Mr. Cullen as the secretary and treasurer.

Senator Gorman is again in the race for the Presidential nomination and in the opinion of his Maryland friends has a reasonable show of obtaining this goal of his life-long ambition. Their expectation is based upon the ground that Judge Parker has failed to touch the chord of popular enthusiasm as he should and that when he goes down at the St. Louis convention, as he will, that a wave of enthusiasm would set in for the Maryland man which will sweep the convention from its feet and make him the nominee of the party.

Hon. C. T. Bland, of Portsmouth, has sent a circular letter throughout the State announcing himself a candidate for Lieutenant-Governor. In this letter he says: "I do not thus announce myself through any great demand of the people, as it has become fashionable to say, but simply and solely from the fact that I want to be Lieutenant-Governor of Virginia, believing firmly that if the trust be committed to my keeping the people who thus repose confidence in me will at least have cause to commend my faithful devotion to the duties of the office."

James H. Hayes, the negro lawyer who was the colleague of Capt. John S. Wise in the suits to overturn the State's new constitution, announces that the adverse decision of the Supreme Court does not end the fight. A case is now on the docket of the United States District Court Richmond which will ultimately go to the Supreme Court, in which the negro hopes to have the legality of the organic law passed upon.

The council at Richmond, Tuesday last, approved the finance committee's report to appropriate \$10,000 to the equestrian statue of "Jeb" Stewart. This insures the erection of a monument of creditable character to the great cavalry leader, the state having already appropriated a like sum and the association having in the treasury a large amount.

The strength of the sentiment for Judge Parker as the Democratic Presidential nominee is indicated by canvasses of the State Democratic Committee, which met a few days ago in Richmond. Practically without exception the members are for the New Yorker.

Mr. E. L. C. Scott, pension clerk in the Auditor's office, has begun sending out checks to Confederate pensioners under the act of 1888. Checks were mailed to 1,650 persons on Tuesday. The aggregate sum to be paid out will be about \$90,000.

Virginia News.

A letter has been made public by Judge W. F. Rhea declining to run for Congress in the ninth district. J. C. Wynn of Pulaski will be the Democratic nominee.

University of South Norfolk, has given \$5,000 with which to erect a new building. The Methodist Exchange, W. H. Vincent and John P. Branch have the sum required to build the grades connecting the house with the administration building.

The special session of Lunenburg Circuit Court, held Monday to consider applications for distillery license made by W. P. Wallace and W. H. Rutledge, lasted just 15 minutes. The opposition to each application was so formidable that they were both withdrawn. There is now no barroom or distillery in Lunenburg county.

Fire almost destroyed the steamer Pocahontas of the Virginia Navigation Company, as she lay at her wharf at Richmond, Saturday night. The fire originated in the engine room. The Pocahontas was built in 1892 at Wilmington, Delaware, and cost \$100,000. Loss is covered by insurance. The Pocahontas, ever since her launching, had made continuous trips between Richmond and Norfolk.

At the last meeting of the State Democratic Committee a subcommittee was appointed to draft a new primary plan, the one now in use being subject to serious objection. This committee, which consists of one member of each Congressional district, is engaged in the preparation of a report which will be presented to the full committee the day prior to the meeting of the State convention June 9. The principal change, it is said, will be the elimination of the viva voce system and the substitution of the secret ballot. A number of other changes will be made designed to strengthen the plan.
