The fact, that the roads generally in our county during the past winter were "bad" and at times in some sections almost impassible, will not be questioned by anyone.

That the members of the Board want good roads, we take it for granted, and that in the provisions of some of the many road laws enacted by the recent General Assembly they may find a way for the improvement of our roads, we respectfully submit.

The statute, it will be noted, is twofold in its effect. It is designed to have purely repair work on roads done frequently and substantially by a local man selected by the tax-payers and it gives opportunity for putting into practical effect the known fact, that a majority of the tax-payers and immediate users of a road are frequently willing to pay something extra for the improvement of such particular road, and can see that it will pay them to do so, whereas they would object to an increase of the general county or district road-tax.

This law seems to be adapted to our needs, for the reason, that our roads for the most part being "sandy" cannot be made permanently good without an immense outlay of money, but can by frequent repair work, in draining them and in keeping the holes filled up, be made reasonably good throughout the whole year.

A regulation of the Diamond State Telephone Company, in effect April 1st, requiring phone holders to pay an extra ten cents for messages beyond a limited area, will result in a loss of patronage to that company, which it cannot afford, perhaps, unless said order is reversed.

The creation of an artificial island in the middle of the entrance to Chesapeake bay is proposed by the joint board on coast defense as an absolute essential to the defense of the national capital and the cities of Baltimore, Norfolk, Newport News and even Richmond.

The use of the name of General Robert E. Lee to advertise along with his picture a new brand of flour is being condemned generally in the South. Ex-Confederate leaders call it a "coining of gold out of sentiment," "commercializing sentiment," and "an insult to the dead general, who, it is pointed out, refused in his lifetime large offers in New York and elsewhere for the simple use of his name commercially."

Chairman W. McDonald Lee, of the Fisheries Board, has ordered a meeting of the board in Norfolk on April 15th. The meeting will last four days and at that time alleged trespass cases on the part of Warwick county oystermen will be heard.

Virginia Items.

Dr. R. H. Pitt, who has been filling the pulpit of the Ashland Baptist church for the past seven years, resigned Sunday.

The Council of Manassas has raised the liquor license from \$300 to \$700 and recommended licenses for four applicants.

The branch postoffice at the University of Virginia was blown by burglars early Saturday morning. The safe was wrecked, three hundred dollars in cash, a considerable quantity of stamps and registered letters missing. The building was badly damaged.

The attitude of Speaker Cannon is going to have a serious effect upon the Jameson Appropriation bill. He may oppose the appropriation. He may refuse to recognize anybody who desires to call up the bill.

Judge Ingram in the Law and Equity Court in Richmond gives a decision in which he holds valid the act of the General Assembly in regard to the assessments made for the property in the State last year. The validity of the act was attacked by large property interests, the efforts being made to compel the assessment on the basis of five years ago.

In the Massachusetts House Wednesday the joint Committee on Ways and Means reported a resolution appropriating \$75,000 for State representation at the Jamestown Exposition next year.
