THE KENT CLUB OF THE LAW DEPARTMENT OF JOHN B. STETSON UNIVERSITY

The Kent Club is a literary and debating society composed entirely of students in the law school. It is a well recognized fact that those who study law with a view to becoming advocates should give attention to the subject of public speaking. It is a fact equally well recognized that excellence in public speaking is not simply a gift of nature, but is the result of patient and persistent labor and study.

Recognizing the soundness of the last two propositions, the students, twelve in number, with two members of the law faculty, met in Room 5, Elizabeth Hall, October 5, 1901, and as a result of that meeting the Kent Club was brought into existence.

At the present time the county is allowing the family \$5 per month. This is not a very princely amount on which to feed four mouths, buy medicines, clothes, etc.
