CHARTER OF MIRAMAR CLUB.

We, the undersigned, associate ourselves together to become incorporated as a Social Club in accordance with Sections 2839 and 2837 of the General Statutes of the State of Florida:

ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation is the "Miramar Club" and its principal place of business is Amelia Beach, in Nassau county and near the City of Fernandina, Florida.

ARTICLE II.

The general object of the corporation shall be the promotion of social intercourse among its members, with all the rights, powers and privileges permitted by Sections 2839 and 2837 of the General Statutes of the State of Florida, authorizing the incorporation of social Clubs or Societies not for profit, including the collection of money under the name of fees, dues, fines, rents, sales or otherwise, such as may be prescribed in the by-laws, to the end solely of promoting social intercourse as aforesaid and not for profit or dividends, and, to such end solely, the acquiring, holding, leasing, mortgaging, selling, transferring, and conveying of property, real and personal.

ARTICLE III.

The corporation shall be managed by a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer and three other members, who shall together constitute the Board of Directors, until the by-laws duly adopted may otherwise provide; they shall be elected annually on the first Tuesday in April of each year; the by-laws may prescribe the details of such election, and may, by amendment, change the date of the annual election.

ARTICLE IV.

All white male persons over the age of twenty-one years shall be eligible for membership in the club subject, only such requirements and conditions as may be prescribed by the by-laws.

ARTICLE V.

The term for which this corporation shall exist shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness liability to which the corporation may subject itself shall never be greater than two thirds of the value of the property of the corporation.

ARTICLE VII.

The amount in value of real estate which the corporation may hold shall not exceed at any time Five Thousand Dollars, without the approval of the Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Court of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE VIII.

The following officers shall manage the affairs of the Corporation until the first annual election of officers under the charter on the first Tuesday in April, A. D. 1908:

ARTICLE IX.

The by-laws of the corporation shall be made by the Directors but may be amended or rescinded by a majority of members present at any regular meeting or meeting called for the purpose.
