



PRISONER'S DARING JUMP

From Train Going Thirty Miles an
Hour, but is Recaptured.

Waycross, Ga., Dec. 14.—A young
white man named Kater Merritt, en
route from Jacksonville to Pelham,
Ga., where there are several charges
against him, tried to effect his escape
from Deputy Sheriff G. A. McElvey
this afternoon by jumping from At-
lantic Coast Line passenger train No.
85, near Blackbear. The train was
going thirty miles an hour when Mer-
ritt jumped, and it seems miraculous
that he escaped instant death.
Merritt fell on his head and back,

rolling down an embankment of
about fifteen feet. He was uncon-
scious when picked up, and remained
in that condition until the train was
near Waycross. Lumps in his neck
and about the shoulders showed he
was seriously injured, and the result
may be fatal.

It seems that the prisoner had asked
for water, and one hand had been
released from the handcuffs so that
he might drink. Taking advantage
of this, he made a hasty exit from the
smoker and jumped. The train was
backed to where Merritt jumped off,
and medical attention given imme-
diately.


