

BRUTALLY MURDERED FRIEND

Because He Wouldn't Open a Bottle of Whiskey.

Statesboro, Ga., Dec. 23.—As a result of refusing to open a bottle of whiskey Wink Mikell, a white man, was instantly killed last night near Rocky Ford by Joe Woods, also white.

Woods and Mikell were riding together and Woods insisted that Mikell open his whiskey. They both had whiskey and are said to have been drinking heavily. Mikell refused to open his and a row ensued, Woods blowing the top of Mikell's head off with a shotgun.

Sheriff Kendrick was notified this morning and went to Rocky Ford on the morning Central train. The alleged murderer was brought here tonight and jailed.

Woods, it is understood, made no effort to escape. After the killing he went to his home, where he was found by the sheriff.

PREACHER DEMANDED MONEY.

Congregation Came Forth With Seven Thousand Dollars.

New York, Dec. 22.—Addressing his wealthy congregation at the close of the formal sermon today, Dr. C. F. Aked, who recently came from Liverpool to become pastor of the Fifth Avenue Baptist church here, declared that he would not contemplate a permanent ministry in the church if the system of finance which made possible a deficiency at the end of the year was continued. "I want," said Mr. Aked, "\$7,000 from you before you leave this church this morning." He got it.

He said the fact that some members of the congregation were wealthy had led others to put the burden of the support of the church on them.

"It is not fair; it is a mean spirit!" exclaimed Dr. Aked. "It has raised up a crowd of stingy souls who won't support the church. It is not fair to me. I am tired of hearing this church called Mr. Smith's, Mr. Brown's or Mr. Robinson's church. I want \$7,000 before you leave the church. The finances must be reorganized so that nothing of the kind can ever happen again."

NEW METHODIST PREACHER

Just Assigned Us by the Conference. The Kind of Man He Is.

A large number of the Methodists of this city are all torn up because of the failure of the conference to return Mr. Atkinson to Ocala for another year. During the year that he was with us he was eminently successful from every point of view. As a pastor he was especially popular. He succeeded in bringing together and harmonizing the discordant elements of the congregation and cemented the forces of the church along all lines of upliftment. Besides being a logical and forceful preacher, Mr. Atkinson is a good mixer and is just such a preacher as the Ocala church needs at this particular time in her history. His unexpected removal can be regarded scarcely less than a denominational calamity, and the regrets of the Methodists are shared by the citizens of the community generally. But one of the strong forces of the Methodist church is the loyalty of its members, and we hope that the exercise of this virtue will be manifested now and exemplified in the reception of the new pastor. We hope that he will be given a warm and generous welcome, that all the members of the church will work together and give the new preacher the same measure of loyalty and devotion that was accorded to the retiring one, and in this way he will be in a position to fill Mr. Atkinson's place in the public estimation. It is a good sign of church zeal to see its members deplored the departure of a pastor. Were it otherwise it would show the want of zeal and fidelity, which is the life of a church and without which no congregation can thrive.

Labor Getting Plentiful.

(Moultrie (Ga.) Observer.)

There is getting to be a great demand for work among laborers of the common class—especially of negro labor. A year ago you had to chase around for an hour or two to pick up a negro for an hour or two of work. Now you can get one on any corner. A year ago turpentine men and mill men were out after hands and had agents in every direction seeking new families. Those who had hands were guarding them as if they were gold for fear that they might be lured off to other places of work. Now it is necessary for every mill or still to lay off a few and the problem of getting work for the hands already employed is worrying the average employer. Not only is labor more plentiful, but it is very much cheaper and also better. A turpentine operator said to a representative of the Observer a day or two ago that he had hands in abundance and he believed he could in a short time employ enough negro labor to work all the turpentine places of the county. He was working good strong men in the woods "raking trees" where they were making about seventy-five cents a day. A year ago these men could not have been induced to do such work and they were then making a dollar and a half a day at other work.

Criminal Court Proceedings.

The case of Joe Bush for selling liquor without license was finished yesterday and a verdict of guilty rendered. Evans Lyford was also convicted of a similar charge. Rebecca Bailey and Lizzie Hays charged with aggravated assault, came clear of the charge.

One liquor case, that of Scott Allen, became very interesting as the jury could not agree. They were out all night last night and for more than half the morning, trying to come to a verdict, but were unsuccessful, reporting to the court at ten o'clock that they could not agree.

The most of today's proceedings have been taken up with the trial of Robert Davis, on a charge of attempted rape. The parties are colored.

If the court makes the progress with the trials today that has been made for the past week, the term of court will be adjourned tonight.
