## Explorers Reported Safe.

New York, Jan. 10.—Anxiety as to the safety of the steamer Baronique bearing Earl Fitzwilliams and a party of distinguished Englishmen, voyaging in the southern Pacific, has been set at rest by dispatches from Panama, cables the Herald's London correspondent. Mysteriously circulated reports last week were to the effect that an accident had befallen the party but they apparently had little foundation and the earl is now said to have landed in Panama, and is on his way home.

Jerusalem, Jan. 10.—The Greek Christmas observances in the Grotto of the nativity city at Bethlehem were marked by a sharp fight between Greek and Latin clergy arising from the old-time jealousy regarding protection of the Grotto. ## Fifty Persons Freeze to Death

Berlin, Jan. 10.—More than fifty persons were frozen to death in the provinces of Eastern Prussia, Western Prussia and Posen during the recent cold period including two letter carriers, the driver of a post wagon, a policeman and 15 fishermen. Nothing has been heard of the lightship stationed off Borkum reef, Hanover, which broke away from her anchor, age Friday night during a terrific storm and went adrift. The government has sent out a steamer to search for the missing vessel. The lightship has a crew of 14 persons.




