Orlando defeated the Jacksonville team at polo in two matches.

Carrabelle will have \$15,000 expended for harbor improvements.

There are several applicants for the position of postmaster at Lakeland.

Franklin county is anxious to have farmers locate on the good lands there.

Frank Butler, a Tampa negro, was given ten years for attempted criminal assault.

The Green Cove Springs Cooperage Company is working extra time to keep up with orders.

Miss Ruth Hinson of Miami was the victor in the vote in that city for Queen of the Carnival.

An East Coast paper calls the new publication at Jacksonville The "Truth" and Homeseker.

Wauchula is bound to have her census taken and the money for the work will be raised by subscription.

The Daytona postoffice has been compelled to increase its facilities to accommodate the rush of business.

The Royal Poinciana at Palm Beach broke the record last week, the number of guests for the day being 1,200.

Ed Courtney gave a rail-splitting bee at his home near Perry, and 2,500 rails were turned out, followed by a "good time" in the evening.

The Lakeland Realty Company has been organized and will ask for letters patent. Messrs. D. H. Sloan, E. H. Youngs, Jr., and R. O. Cresap are the principal stockholders.

Palmetto will have an ice factory and canning factory, and The News says they need a hotel. Judging from the prices at which some hotels hold their accommodations, there is money in the hotel business.

The orange growers around Bartow are looking good, says The Courier-Informant, and with but few exceptions the trees show but little evidence of having passed through a severe cold. Indication of new growth here apparent and the trees in many groves will be in bloom in about ten days or two weeks.

The Western Union Telegraph Company has been having a great deal of trouble to maintain an uninterrupted telegraph service both for commercial messages and railroad business for this town of late, due probably to the bad condition of the lines near Tribby. Several prominent business men and orange shippers have taken the matter up with the officials of the company and it is hoped that better service will result.—St. Petersburg Sun.

Ice Gorge Breaks at Cincinnati.
Cincinnati, O., Feb. 27.—The ice gorges from the Ohio river in this vicinity which were the heaviest known for many years, began to give way during the night, several breaks occurring at various points. The final break is expected tonight. Although the river rose several feet during the night, the ice was so heavy that it soon caught again, forming new gorges. Property damage of about \$75,000 was caused by these early movements.

Chemist to Visit Food Bureau.
New York, Feb. 27.—An assistant to Dr. Wiley, chief of the bureau of chemistry of the agricultural department, has arrived to make an inspection of the bureau of food analysis of the appraisers stores, preparatory to establishing similar laboratories in Boston, New Orleans and San Francisco. The New York bureau was established six months ago as an experiment. Under the present system importers receive their goods two or three days sooner than under the old system.

TURKISH POLICE ASSASSINATED.

A Number of Ottoman Subjects Have Been Murdered by Strikers.

Constantinople, Feb. 27.—Advices from Batoum say the prefect of police and several leading merchants of that city have been assassinated and that numbers of Ottoman subjects have been murdered by Georgian strikers. The porte has drawn the attention of the Russian embassy to the situation and the latter has promised the necessary protection. Revolutionary manifestos in favor of a republic are being circulated broadcast at Batoum. The movement is not confined to the city workers, but has many adherents among the peasants and agricultural classes who claim that the land owners are treating them as serfs. The whole of the Caucasus is said to be seething with disaffection. Armenians, Jews and people of other nationalities and creeds are aiding the strikers, who appear to be acting under the orders of a committee at St. Petersburg.
